## Associations of "For devastating" (30 Words)

<b>aftershock</b>	A tremor (or one of a series of tremors) occurring after the main shock of an earthquake.
<b>avalanche</b>	Engulf or carry off by an avalanche. <i>The climbers were <b>avalanched</b> down the south face of the mountain.</i>
<b>calamitous</b>	Involving calamity; catastrophic or disastrous. <i>A <b>calamitous</b> defeat.</i>
<b><u>catastrophic</u></b>	Relating to geological catastrophism. <i>A <b>catastrophic</b> earthquake.</i>
<b><u>conflagration</u></b>	A very intense and uncontrolled fire. <i>Tinder dry conditions sparked fears of a <b>conflagration</b> in many drought devastated communities.</i>
<b>crushing</b>	Causing overwhelming disappointment or embarrassment. <i>Bone <b>crushing</b>.</i>
<b>damage</b>	Inflict damage upon. <i>The scandal could seriously <b>damage</b> his career.</i>
<b>deadly</b>	Involving loss of divine grace or spiritual death. <i>A <b>deadly</b> serious remark.</i>
<b><u>destructive</u></b>	Causing destruction or much damage. <i>The <b>destructive</b> power of weapons.</i>
<b><u>detrimental</u></b>	Tending to cause harm. <i>Moving her could have a <b>detrimental</b> effect on her health.</i>
<b>devastate</b>	Overwhelm or overpower. <i>He was <b>devastated</b> by his grief when his son died.</i>
<b><u>earthquake</u></b>	Shaking and vibration at the surface of the earth resulting from underground movement along a fault plane or from volcanic activity. <i>A political <b>earthquake</b>.</i>
<b><u>epicenter</u></b>	The point on the Earth's surface directly above the focus of an earthquake.

<b><u>fatal</u></b>	Having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. <i>A <b>fatal</b> accident.</i>
<b><u>harmful</u></b>	Causing or likely to cause harm. <i>Sugars which can be <b>harmful</b> to the teeth.</i>
<b><u>hazard</u></b>	The pocketing of the cue ball off another ball. <i>He <b>hazarded</b> a guess.</i>
<b>incapacitate</b>	Make unable to perform a certain action. <i>He was <b>incapacitated</b> by a heart attack.</i>
<b>injurious</b>	Causing or likely to cause damage or harm. <i>Food which is <b>injurious</b> to health.</i>
<b>landslide</b>	A slide of a large mass of dirt and rock down a mountain or cliff. <i>The road was blocked by a <b>landslide</b>.</i>
<b><u>lethal</u></b>	(in a sporting context) very accurate or skilful. <i>A <b>lethal</b> injection.</i>
<b>mortal</b>	Subject to death. <i>A <b>mortal</b> illness.</i>
<b><u>pernicious</u></b>	Working or spreading in a hidden and usually injurious way. <i>The <b>pernicious</b> influences of the mass media.</i>
<b>ruinous</b>	Costing far more than can be afforded. <i>The cost of their ransom might be <b>ruinous</b>.</i>
<b>seismograph</b>	An instrument that measures and records details of earthquakes, such as force and duration.
<b>slayer</b>	Someone who kills a person or animal in a violent way. <i>A dragon <b>slayer</b>.</i>
<b><u>stifling</u></b>	Forceful prevention; putting down by power or authority. <i><b>Stifling</b> heat.</i>
<b>suppression</b>	The conscious exclusion of unacceptable thoughts or desires. <i>The <b>suppression</b> of heresy.</i>
<b><u>toxicity</u></b>	The degree to which something is poisonous. <i>That was how I protected my partner from my family's <b>toxicity</b>.</i>
<b><u>tsunami</u></b>	A long, high sea wave caused by an earthquake or other disturbance. <i>A <b>tsunami</b> of data pours into the CNBC newsroom every minute of every trading day.</i>
<b>withering</b>	(of heat) intense; scorching. <i>The guns opened a <b>withering</b> fire.</i>
