aftershock	A tremor (or one of a series of tremors) occurring after the main shock of an earthquake.
avalanche	Engulf or carry off by an avalanche. The climbers were <b>avalanche</b> d down the south face of the mountain.
calamitous	Involving calamity; catastrophic or disastrous. A <b>calamitous</b> defeat.
<u>catastrophic</u>	Relating to geological catastrophism. A <b>catastrophic</b> earthquake.
<u>conflagration</u>	A very intense and uncontrolled fire. <i>Tinder dry conditions sparked fears of a <b>conflagration</b> in many drought devastated communities.</i>
crushing	Causing overwhelming disappointment or embarrassment. Bone crushing.
damage	Inflict damage upon. The scandal could seriously <b>damage</b> his career.
deadly	Involving loss of divine grace or spiritual death. A <b>deadly</b> serious remark.
<u>destructive</u>	Causing destruction or much damage. <i>The <b>destructive</b> power of weapons.</i>
<u>detrimental</u>	Tending to cause harm. Moving her could have a <b>detrimental</b> effect on her health.
devastate	Overwhelm or overpower. He was <b>devastate</b> d by his grief when his son died.
<u>earthquake</u>	Shaking and vibration at the surface of the earth resulting from underground movement along a fault plane of from volcanic activity. <i>A political earthquake</i> .
<u>epicenter</u>	The point on the Earth's surface directly above the focus of an earthquake.



<u>fatal</u>	Having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. <i>A <b>fatal</b> accident.</i>
<u>harmful</u>	Causing or likely to cause harm. Sugars which can be <b>harmful</b> to the teeth.
<u>hazard</u>	The pocketing of the cue ball off another ball. <i>He <b>hazard</b>ed a guess.</i>
incapacitate	Make unable to perform a certain action. <i>He was <b>incapacitate</b>d by a heart attack.</i>
injurious	Causing or likely to cause damage or harm. Food which is <b>injurious</b> to health.
landslide	A slide of a large mass of dirt and rock down a mountain or cliff. <i>The road was blocked by a <b>landslide</b></i> .
<u>lethal</u>	(in a sporting context) very accurate or skilful. A <b>lethal</b> injection.
mortal	Subject to death. A <b>mortal</b> illness.
<u>pernicious</u>	Working or spreading in a hidden and usually injurious way. The <b>pernicious</b> influences of the mass media.
ruinous	Costing far more than can be afforded. <i>The cost of their ransom might be <b>ruinous</b>.</i>
seismograph	An instrument that measures and records details of earthquakes, such as force and duration.
slayer	Someone who kills a person or animal in a violent way. A dragon <b>slayer</b> .
<u>stifling</u>	Forceful prevention; putting down by power or authority. <i>Stifling</i> heat.
suppression	The conscious exclusion of unacceptable thoughts or desires. <i>The <b>suppression</b> of heresy.</i>
toxicity	The degree to which something is poisonous. That was how I protected my partner from my family s <b>toxicity</b> .
<u>tsunami</u>	A long, high sea wave caused by an earthquake or other disturbance. A <b>tsunami</b> of data pours into the CNBC newsroom every minute of every trading day.
withering	(of heat) intense; scorching. The guns opened a <b>withering</b> fire.
