| aftershock | A tremor (or one of a series of tremors) occurring after the main shock of an earthquake. |
| avalanche | Engulf or carry off by an avalanche. <i>The climbers were avalanched down the south face of the mountain.</i> |
| calamitous | Involving calamity; catastrophic or disastrous. <i>A calamitous defeat.</i> |
| <u>catastrophic</u> | Relating to geological catastrophism. <i>A catastrophic earthquake.</i> |
| <u>conflagration</u> | A very intense and uncontrolled fire. <i>Tinder dry conditions sparked fears of a conflagration in many drought devastated communities.</i> |
| crushing | Causing overwhelming disappointment or embarrassment. <i>Bone crushing.</i> |
| damage | Inflict damage upon. <i>The scandal could seriously damage his career.</i> |
| deadly | Involving loss of divine grace or spiritual death. <i>A deadly serious remark.</i> |
| <u>destructive</u> | Causing destruction or much damage. <i>The destructive power of weapons.</i> |
| <u>detrimental</u> | Tending to cause harm. <i>Moving her could have a detrimental effect on her health.</i> |
| devastate | Overwhelm or overpower. <i>He was devastated by his grief when his son died.</i> |
| <u>earthquake</u> | Shaking and vibration at the surface of the earth resulting from underground movement along a fault plane or from volcanic activity. <i>A political earthquake.</i> |
| <u>epicenter</u> | The point on the Earth's surface directly above the focus of an earthquake. |

| <u>fatal</u> | Having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin. <i>A fatal accident.</i> |
| <u>harmful</u> | Causing or likely to cause harm. <i>Sugars which can be harmful to the teeth.</i> |
| <u>hazard</u> | The pocketing of the cue ball off another ball. <i>He hazarded a guess.</i> |
| incapacitate | Make unable to perform a certain action. <i>He was incapacitated by a heart attack.</i> |
| injurious | Causing or likely to cause damage or harm. <i>Food which is injurious to health.</i> |
| landslide | A slide of a large mass of dirt and rock down a mountain or cliff. <i>The road was blocked by a landslide.</i> |
| <u>lethal</u> | (in a sporting context) very accurate or skilful. <i>A lethal injection.</i> |
| mortal | Subject to death. <i>A mortal illness.</i> |
| <u>pernicious</u> | Working or spreading in a hidden and usually injurious way. <i>The pernicious influences of the mass media.</i> |
| ruinous | Costing far more than can be afforded. <i>The cost of their ransom might be ruinous.</i> |
| seismograph | An instrument that measures and records details of earthquakes, such as force and duration. |
| slayer | Someone who kills a person or animal in a violent way. <i>A dragon slayer.</i> |
| <u>stifling</u> | Forceful prevention; putting down by power or authority. <i>Stifling heat.</i> |
| suppression | The conscious exclusion of unacceptable thoughts or desires. <i>The suppression of heresy.</i> |
| <u>toxicity</u> | The degree to which something is poisonous. <i>That was how I protected my partner from my family's toxicity.</i> |
| <u>tsunami</u> | A long, high sea wave caused by an earthquake or other disturbance. <i>A tsunami of data pours into the CNBC newsroom every minute of every trading day.</i> |
| withering | (of heat) intense; scorching. <i>The guns opened a withering fire.</i> |
