devastate Overwhelm or overpower.

He was **devastate**d by his grief when his son died.

**earthquake** underground movement along a fault plane of from volcanic activity.

A political earthquake.

**epicenter** The point on the Earth's surface directly above the focus of an earthquake.



Having extremely unfortunate or dire consequences; bringing ruin.

A fatal accident.

harmful Causing or likely to cause harm.

Sugars which can be **harmful** to the teeth.

hazard The pocketing of the cue ball off another ball.

He **hazard**ed a guess.

incapacitate Make unable to perform a certain action.

He was **incapacitate**d by a heart attack.

injurious Causing or likely to cause damage or harm.

Food which is **injurious** to health.

landslide A slide of a large mass of dirt and rock down a mountain or cliff.

The road was blocked by a landslide.

(in a sporting context) very accurate or skilful.

lethal A lethal injection.

mortal Subject to death. *A mortal illness.* 

Working or spreading in a hidden and usually injurious way.

The **pernicious** influences of the mass media.

ruinous Costing far more than can be afforded.

The cost of their ransom might be **ruinous**.

seismograph An instrument that measures and records details of earthquakes, such as

force and duration.

slayer Someone who kills a person or animal in a violent way.

A dragon **slayer**.

**stifling** Forceful prevention; putting down by power or authority.

**Stifling** heat.

**suppression** The conscious exclusion of unacceptable thoughts or desires.

The **suppression** of heresy.

The degree to which something is poisonous.

That was how I protected my partner from my family s **toxicity**.

A long, high sea wave caused by an earthquake or other disturbance.

**tsunami** A **tsunami** of data pours into the CNBC newsroom every minute of every

trading day.

withering (of heat) intense; scorching.

The guns opened a **withering** fire.
