| apoplexy | Extreme anger. <i>The decision has aroused apoplexy among environmentalists.</i> |
| ascension | A movement upward. <i>His ascension to the presidency.</i> |
| autopsy | Perform an autopsy on a dead body do a post mortem. <i>On autopsy it was established that he had suffered from a rare brain condition.</i> |
| bier | A coffin along with its stand. <i>We followed the bier to the graveyard.</i> |
| dead | Devoid of living things. <i>Crater Lake is in the crater of a dead volcano of the Cascade Range.</i> |
| death | The personification of death. <i>I don t believe in life after death.</i> |
| decease | Pass from physical life and lose all bodily attributes and functions necessary to sustain life. <i>He held the post until his untimely decease in 1991.</i> |
| deceased | Someone who is no longer alive. <i>He is deceased.</i> |
| defunct | No longer existing or functioning. <i>A defunct Indian tribe.</i> |
| disappear | Get lost, as without warning or explanation. <i>He disappeared without a trace.</i> |
| doom | Make certain of the failure or destruction of. <i>The aircraft was sent crashing to its doom in the water.</i> |

| expire | (of a person) die. <i>The volume of expired air.</i> |
| extinct | No longer in existence; lost or especially having died out leaving no living representatives. <i>We might one day resurrect extinct species.</i> |
| funeral | A sermon delivered at a funeral. <i>In the afternoon he d attended a funeral.</i> |
| gone | No longer available; consumed or used up. <i>The food s all gone I m afraid.</i> |
| holocaust | Destruction or slaughter on a mass scale, especially caused by fire or nuclear war. <i>A nuclear holocaust.</i> |
| inelastic | (of a collision) involving an overall loss of translational kinetic energy. <i>A tough inelastic membrane.</i> |
| intestacy | The situation of being or dying without a legally valid will. |
| intestate | Not having made a will before one dies. <i>He died intestate.</i> |
| moribund | Not growing or changing; without force or vitality. <i>The moribund commercial property market.</i> |
| mortality | The state of being subject to death. <i>Post operative mortality was 90 per cent for some operations.</i> |
| mortuary | A room or building in which dead bodies are kept, for hygienic storage or for examination, until burial or cremation. <i>A mortuary temple.</i> |
| perish | (of rubber, food, etc.) lose its normal qualities; rot or decay. <i>I was perished with cold before the end of the day.</i> |
| rip | A fraud or swindle a rip off. <i>Fire ripped through her bungalow.</i> |
| sepulchral | Of or relating to a sepulchre. <i>Sepulchral monuments.</i> |
| slayer | Someone who causes the death of a person or animal. <i>A dragon slayer.</i> |
| testate | A person who makes a will. <i>He desired to die testate.</i> |
| tombstone | Jump into the sea from a cliff or other high point. <i>Thrill seeking lads tombstoned off the rocks.</i> |
