| agonize | Cause to agonize. <i>A question which will agonize the technocrats.</i> |
| ail | Trouble or afflict (someone) in mind or body. <i>Exercise is good for whatever ails one.</i> |
| challenge | Issue a challenge to. <i>Incumbent Democrats are being challenged in the 29th district.</i> |
| <u>complication</u> | An involved or confused condition or state. <i>Her coming was a serious complication.</i> |
| difficult | Not easy; requiring great physical or mental effort to accomplish or comprehend or endure. <i>The questions are too difficult for the children.</i> |
| difficulty | A thing that is hard to accomplish, deal with, or understand. <i>I managed with difficulty to struggle upright.</i> |
| disquiet | A feeling of mild anxiety about possible developments. <i>It disquiets us that he may be out of jail.</i> |
| distress | Bring into difficulties or distress especially financial hardship. <i>To his distress he saw that she was trembling.</i> |
| hardship | Something that causes or entails suffering- James Boswell. <i>The many hardships of frontier life.</i> |
| <u>impasse</u> | A situation in which no progress can be made or no advancement is possible. <i>The current political impasse.</i> |
| inconvenience | To cause inconvenience or discomfort to. <i>The inconvenience of having to change trains.</i> |

| knotty | Used of old persons or old trees; covered with knobs or knots. <i>A knotty problem.</i> |
| nuisance | An act which is harmful or offensive to the public or a member of it and for which there is a legal remedy. <i>I hope you re not going to make a nuisance of yourself.</i> |
| perturb | Disturb in mind or make uneasy or cause to be worried or alarmed. <i>The electrons were perturbed by the passing ion.</i> |
| <u>plight</u> | A situation from which extrication is difficult especially an unpleasant or trying one. <i>We must direct our efforts towards relieving the plight of children living in poverty.</i> |
| predicament | A difficult, unpleasant, or embarrassing situation. <i>The club s financial predicament.</i> |
| problem | Denoting or relating to people whose behaviour causes difficulties to themselves and others. <i>She and her husband are having problems.</i> |
| problematic | Making great mental demands; hard to comprehend or solve or believe. <i>The situation was problematic for teachers.</i> |
| <u>puzzled</u> | Unable to understand; perplexed. <i>The questioners were met with puzzled looks.</i> |
| <u>quandary</u> | A situation from which extrication is difficult especially an unpleasant or trying one. <i>Kate was in a quandary.</i> |
| <u>questionable</u> | Subject to question. <i>Questionable motives.</i> |
| <u>stalemate</u> | Subject to a stalemate. <i>Last time I played him it ended up in stalemate.</i> |
| suffering | Psychological suffering. <i>Weapons that cause unnecessary suffering.</i> |
| <u>tangled</u> | Highly complex or intricate and occasionally devious. <i>Oh what a tangled web we weave.</i> |
| <u>tortuous</u> | Highly complex or intricate and occasionally devious. <i>A tortuous argument.</i> |
| <u>tough</u> | Feeling physical discomfort or pain tough is occasionally used colloquially for bad. <i>The hastily prepared steak was tough.</i> |
| trouble | Take the trouble to do something concern oneself. <i>He won without any trouble.</i> |

unaccustomed Not customary or usual.
*They finished their supper with **unaccustomed** speed.*

upset The act of upsetting something.
*His carelessness could have caused an ecological **upset**.*
