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| aggravation | Aggressive behaviour; harassment. <i>The patient experienced an aggravation of symptoms.</i> |
| annoy | Cause annoyance in disturb especially by minor irritations. <i>Your damned cheerfulness has always annoyed me.</i> |
| annoyance | The act of troubling or annoying someone. <i>He turned his charm on Tara much to Hegarty s annoyance.</i> |
| annoying | The act of troubling or annoying someone. <i>Unsolicited calls are annoying.</i> |
| awkwardness | Trouble in carrying or managing caused by bulk or shape. <i>There was a moment of awkwardness.</i> |
| bother | Make confused or perplexed or puzzled. <i>A bit of a bother.</i> |
| bothersome | Causing irritation or annoyance. <i>Aircraft noise is particularly bothersome near the airport.</i> |
| disaffected | Discontented as toward authority. <i>A military plot by disaffected elements in the army.</i> |
| discontent | Dissatisfaction with one’s circumstances; lack of contentment. <i>He was discontent with his wages.</i> |
| discontented | Showing or experiencing dissatisfaction or restless longing. <i>Strikes by discontented workers.</i> |
| disgruntled | Angry or dissatisfied. <i>Judges receive letters from disgruntled members of the public.</i> |
| displeasure | Annoy; displeasure. <i>He started hanging around the local pubs much to the displeasure of his mother.</i> |
| dissatisfied | In a state of sulky dissatisfaction. <i>Dissatisfied customers.</i> |

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| distress | Bring into difficulties or distress especially financial hardship. <i>Please don't distress yourself.</i> |
| headache | Something or someone that causes anxiety; a source of unhappiness. <i>She complained of a severe headache.</i> |
| inconvenience | To cause inconvenience or discomfort to. <i>The inconveniences of life in a remote city.</i> |
| <u>irritation</u> | An uncomfortable feeling of mental painfulness or distress. <i>The minor irritations of life.</i> |
| itching | An irritating cutaneous sensation that produces a desire to scratch. |
| malcontent | Dissatisfied and complaining or rebellious. <i>The malcontent generals saw their role as leaders of this counter revolution.</i> |
| <u>nausea</u> | A feeling of sickness with an inclination to vomit. <i>The stories will launch a wave of public nausea and outrage.</i> |
| nuisance | A bothersome annoying person. <i>I hope you're not going to make a nuisance of yourself.</i> |
| offend | Act in disregard of laws, rules, contracts, or promises. <i>The smell of ash offended him.</i> |
| trouble | Take the trouble to do something concern oneself. <i>Friends should support each other when they are in trouble.</i> |
| umbrage | A feeling of anger caused by being offended. <i>She took umbrage at his remarks.</i> |
| unacceptable | Not acceptable; not welcome. <i>Unacceptable behaviour.</i> |
| unhappy | Marked by or producing unhappiness. <i>Many were unhappy about the scale of the cuts.</i> |
| unpleasantness | The quality of giving displeasure. <i>She hated unpleasantness though she wouldn't back down from a fight.</i> |
| vex | Angry; annoyed. <i>Vex the subject of the death penalty.</i> |
| <u>vexation</u> | Anger produced by some annoying irritation. <i>Jenna bit her lip in vexation.</i> |
| vexing | Causing irritation or annoyance. <i>The most vexing questions for policymakers.</i> |
