<b>aggravation</b>	Aggressive behaviour; harassment. <i>The patient experienced an <b>aggravation</b> of symptoms.</i>
<a href="#">annoy</a>	Cause annoyance in disturb especially by minor irritations. <i>Your damned cheerfulness has always <b>annoyed</b> me.</i>
<b>annoyance</b>	The act of troubling or annoying someone. <i>He turned his charm on Tara much to Hegarty s <b>annoyance</b>.</i>
<b>annoying</b>	The act of troubling or annoying someone. <i>Unsolicited calls are <b>annoying</b>.</i>
<a href="#">awkwardness</a>	Trouble in carrying or managing caused by bulk or shape. <i>There was a moment of <b>awkwardness</b>.</i>
<b>bother</b>	Make confused or perplexed or puzzled. <i>A bit of a <b>bother</b>.</i>
<b>bothersome</b>	Causing irritation or annoyance. <i>Aircraft noise is particularly <b>bothersome</b> near the airport.</i>
<b>disaffected</b>	Discontented as toward authority. <i>A military plot by <b>disaffected</b> elements in the army.</i>
<b>discontent</b>	Dissatisfaction with one’s circumstances; lack of contentment. <i>He was <b>discontent</b> with his wages.</i>
<b>discontented</b>	Showing or experiencing dissatisfaction or restless longing. <i>Strikes by <b>discontented</b> workers.</i>
<a href="#">disgruntled</a>	Angry or dissatisfied. <i>Judges receive letters from <b>disgruntled</b> members of the public.</i>
<a href="#">displeasure</a>	Annoy; displease. <i>He started hanging around the local pubs much to the <b>displeasure</b> of his mother.</i>
<a href="#">dissatisfied</a>	In a state of sulky dissatisfaction. <i><b>Dissatisfied</b> customers.</i>

<b>distress</b>	Bring into difficulties or distress especially financial hardship. <i>Please don't <b>distress</b> yourself.</i>
<b>headache</b>	Something or someone that causes anxiety; a source of unhappiness. <i>She complained of a severe <b>headache</b>.</i>
<b>inconvenience</b>	To cause inconvenience or discomfort to. <i>The <b>inconveniences</b> of life in a remote city.</i>
<u><a href="#">irritation</a></u>	An uncomfortable feeling of mental painfulness or distress. <i>The minor <b>irritations</b> of life.</i>
<b>itching</b>	An irritating cutaneous sensation that produces a desire to scratch.
<b>malcontent</b>	Dissatisfied and complaining or rebellious. <i>The <b>malcontent</b> generals saw their role as leaders of this counter revolution.</i>
<u><a href="#">nausea</a></u>	A feeling of sickness with an inclination to vomit. <i>The stories will launch a wave of public <b>nausea</b> and outrage.</i>
<b>nuisance</b>	A bothersome annoying person. <i>I hope you're not going to make a <b>nuisance</b> of yourself.</i>
<b>offend</b>	Act in disregard of laws, rules, contracts, or promises. <i>The smell of ash <b>offended</b> him.</i>
<b>trouble</b>	Take the trouble to do something concern oneself. <i>Friends should support each other when they are in <b>trouble</b>.</i>
<b>umbrage</b>	A feeling of anger caused by being offended. <i>She took <b>umbrage</b> at his remarks.</i>
<b>unacceptable</b>	Not acceptable; not welcome. <i><b>Unacceptable</b> behaviour.</i>
<b>unhappy</b>	Marked by or producing unhappiness. <i>Many were <b>unhappy</b> about the scale of the cuts.</i>
<b>unpleasantness</b>	The quality of giving displeasure. <i>She hated <b>unpleasantness</b> though she wouldn't back down from a fight.</i>
<b>vex</b>	Angry; annoyed. <i><b>Vex</b> the subject of the death penalty.</i>
<u><a href="#">vexation</a></u>	Anger produced by some annoying irritation. <i>Jenna bit her lip in <b>vexation</b>.</i>
<b>vexing</b>	Causing irritation or annoyance. <i>The most <b>vexing</b> questions for policymakers.</i>
