alert	A warning serves to make you more alert to danger. <i>Alert to the problems.</i>
<u>apparent</u>	Clearly revealed to the mind or the senses or judgment. <i>It became apparent that he was talented.</i>
appropriateness	Appropriate conduct; doing the right thing. <i>Some staff members question the appropriateness of this practice.</i>
clearly	Without doubt or question. <i>On white paper the seeds are clearly visible.</i>
<u>conspicuous</u>	Obvious to the eye or mind. <i>Made herself conspicuous by her exhibitionistic preening.</i>
defined	Clearly characterized or delimited. <i>Each child has clearly defined duties.</i>
<u>definite</u>	Clear or undeniable (used for emphasis). <i>I want a definite answer.</i>
differentiated	Made different (especially in the course of development) or shown to be different.
<u>discreet</u>	Unobtrusively perceptive and sympathetic. <i>A discreet silence.</i>
<u>distinctive</u>	Capable of being classified. <i>Juniper berries give gin its distinctive flavour.</i>
especial	For or belonging chiefly to one person or thing. <i>Her outburst was for my especial benefit.</i>
featured	Having distinctive attributes or aspects of a specified kind. <i>The front of the chassis is well featured.</i>
flagrant	(of an action considered wrong or immoral) conspicuously or obviously offensive. <i>A flagrant violation of the law.</i>

judicious	Marked by the exercise of good judgment or common sense in practical matters. <i>The judicious use of public investment.</i>
<u>manifest</u>	Record in a ship's manifest. <i>Lizzy manifested signs of severe depression.</i>
marked	Strongly marked easily noticeable. <i>A marked increase in UK sales.</i>
<u>noticeable</u>	Undesirably noticeable. <i>Noticeable for its vivid historical background.</i>
noticed	Being perceived or observed. <i>An easily noticed effect on the rate of growth.</i>
obvious	Easily perceived by the senses or grasped by the mind. <i>It was an obvious remark to make.</i>
<u>particularly</u>	Used to single out a subject to which a statement is especially applicable. <i>I don't particularly want to be reminded of that time.</i>
peculiar	Characteristic of one only; distinctive or special. <i>Rights peculiar to the rich.</i>
plain	Express complaints discontent displeasure or unhappiness. <i>A plain girl with a freckled face.</i>
pronounced	Very noticeable or marked; conspicuous. <i>He had a pronounced squint.</i>
sensible	Showing reason or sound judgment. <i>A sensible odor.</i>
<u>specialized</u>	Requiring or involving detailed and specific knowledge or training. <i>Specialized software.</i>
<u>specific</u>	A medicine that has a mitigating effect on a specific disease. <i>I wish I'd put more thought into the specifics.</i>
<u>specifically</u>	In distinction from others. <i>The problem was specifically mentioned in the report.</i>
<u>unambiguous</u>	Admitting of no doubt or misunderstanding; having only one meaning or interpretation and leading to only one conclusion. <i>As a horror apartheid is absolutely unambiguous.</i>
<u>unequivocal</u>	Leaving no doubt; unambiguous. <i>An unequivocal or univocal statement.</i>
visibly	In a way that is visible to the eye. <i>He was visibly irritated at the way he had been undermined.</i>
