backwards	In reverse of the usual direction or order. <i>A step backwards for the economy.</i>
<u>blemish</u>	Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective. <i>The offences were an uncharacteristic blemish on an otherwise clean record.</i>
<u>con</u>	Deprive of by deceit. <i>The Charter is a glossy public relations con.</i>
damage	Suffer or be susceptible to damage. <i>Bombing caused extensive damage to the town.</i>
damaging	(sometimes followed by `to') causing harm or injury. <i>Damaging allegations of corruption.</i>
<u>deface</u>	Spoil the surface or appearance of (something), for example by drawing or writing on it. <i>He defaced library books.</i>
defect	An imperfection in a bodily system. <i>That interpretation is an unfortunate defect of our lack of information.</i>
deficiency	A failing or shortcoming. <i>A budget deficiency of 96 billion.</i>
demerit	A fault or disadvantage. <i>Ten demerits and he loses his privileges.</i>
disadvantage	Put at a disadvantage hinder harm. <i>Situations of serious social and economic disadvantage.</i>
disfigure	Spoil the appearance of. <i>Litter disfigures the countryside.</i>
<u>drawback</u>	An amount of excise or import duty remitted on goods exported. <i>He pointed out all the drawbacks to my plan.</i>

<u>error</u>	A misconception resulting from incorrect information. <i>Goods dispatched to your branch in error.</i>
failing	Failure to reach a minimum required performance. <i>He was quick to point out his wife s failings.</i>
<u>fault</u>	Of a rock formation be broken by a fault or faults. <i>He studied the faulting of the earth s crust.</i>
flaw	Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective. <i>A flaw caused the crystal to shatter.</i>
<u>flawed</u>	Having a blemish or flaw. <i>A flawed diamond.</i>
<u>harm</u>	Cause or do harm to. <i>Smoking when pregnant can harm your baby.</i>
<u>inadequacy</u>	Lack of an adequate quantity or number. <i>Her feelings of personal inadequacy.</i>
injury	An act that causes someone or something to receive physical damage. <i>An ankle injury.</i>
insufficiency	The inability of an organ to perform its normal function. <i>Insufficiency of adequate housing.</i>
misconceive	Interpret in the wrong way. <i>Some academic latinists did misconceive Pound s poem in that way.</i>
<u>misunderstanding</u>	A disagreement or quarrel. <i>There must have been some kind of misunderstanding.</i>
neurotoxin	A poison which acts on the nervous system.
nitpick	Engage in fussy or pedantic fault-finding. <i>The state is nitpicking about minor administrative matters.</i>
problem	A state of difficulty that needs to be resolved. <i>What s the problem.</i>
<u>shortcoming</u>	A fault or failure to meet a certain standard, typically in a person's character, a plan, or a system. <i>He is so forthright about his shortcomings it s hard to chastise him.</i>
sideways	So as to occupy a job or position at the same level as one previously held rather than be promoted or demoted. <i>The lorry slid sideways across the road.</i>
unforced	Not compelled or constrained. <i>A voice with a pleasingly unforced quality.</i>
upside	The highest or uppermost side of anything. <i>Being self employed has its upside.</i>
