## Associations of "For downside" (30 Words)

<b>backwards</b>	In reverse of the usual direction or order. <i>A step <b>backwards</b> for the economy.</i>
<b><u>blemish</u></b>	Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective. <i>The offences were an uncharacteristic <b>blemish</b> on an otherwise clean record.</i>
<b><u>con</u></b>	Deprive of by deceit. <i>The Charter is a glossy public relations <b>con</b>.</i>
<b>damage</b>	Suffer or be susceptible to damage. <i>Bombing caused extensive <b>damage</b> to the town.</i>
<b>damaging</b>	(sometimes followed by `to') causing harm or injury. <i><b>Damaging</b> allegations of corruption.</i>
<b><u>deface</u></b>	Spoil the surface or appearance of (something), for example by drawing or writing on it. <i>He <b>defaced</b> library books.</i>
<b>defect</b>	An imperfection in a bodily system. <i>That interpretation is an unfortunate <b>defect</b> of our lack of information.</i>
<b>deficiency</b>	A failing or shortcoming. <i>A budget <b>deficiency</b> of 96 billion.</i>
<b>demerit</b>	A fault or disadvantage. <i>Ten <b>demerits</b> and he loses his privileges.</i>
<b>disadvantage</b>	Put at a disadvantage hinder harm. <i>Situations of serious social and economic <b>disadvantage</b>.</i>
<b>disfigure</b>	Spoil the appearance of. <i>Litter <b>disfigures</b> the countryside.</i>
<b><u>drawback</u></b>	An amount of excise or import duty remitted on goods exported. <i>He pointed out all the <b>drawbacks</b> to my plan.</i>

<b><u>error</u></b>	A misconception resulting from incorrect information. <i>Goods dispatched to your branch in <b>error</b>.</i>
<b>failing</b>	Failure to reach a minimum required performance. <i>He was quick to point out his wife s <b>failings</b>.</i>
<b><u>fault</u></b>	Of a rock formation be broken by a fault or faults. <i>He studied the <b>faulting</b> of the earth s crust.</i>
<b>flaw</b>	Add a flaw or blemish to make imperfect or defective. <i>A <b>flaw</b> caused the crystal to shatter.</i>
<b><u>flawed</u></b>	Having a blemish or flaw. <i>A <b>flawed</b> diamond.</i>
<b><u>harm</u></b>	Cause or do harm to. <i>Smoking when pregnant can <b>harm</b> your baby.</i>
<b><u>inadequacy</u></b>	Lack of an adequate quantity or number. <i>Her feelings of personal <b>inadequacy</b>.</i>
<b>injury</b>	An act that causes someone or something to receive physical damage. <i>An ankle <b>injury</b>.</i>
<b>insufficiency</b>	The inability of an organ to perform its normal function. <i><b>Insufficiency</b> of adequate housing.</i>
<b>misconceive</b>	Interpret in the wrong way. <i>Some academic latinists did <b>misconceive</b> Pound s poem in that way.</i>
<b><u>misunderstanding</u></b>	A disagreement or quarrel. <i>There must have been some kind of <b>misunderstanding</b>.</i>
<b>neurotoxin</b>	A poison which acts on the nervous system.
<b>nitpick</b>	Engage in fussy or pedantic fault-finding. <i>The state is <b>nitpicking</b> about minor administrative matters.</i>
<b>problem</b>	A state of difficulty that needs to be resolved. <i>What s the <b>problem</b>.</i>
<b><u>shortcoming</u></b>	A fault or failure to meet a certain standard, typically in a person's character, a plan, or a system. <i>He is so forthright about his <b>shortcomings</b> it s hard to chastise him.</i>
<b>sideways</b>	So as to occupy a job or position at the same level as one previously held rather than be promoted or demoted. <i>The lorry slid <b>sideways</b> across the road.</i>
<b>unforced</b>	Not compelled or constrained. <i>A voice with a pleasingly <b>unforced</b> quality.</i>
<b>upside</b>	The highest or uppermost side of anything. <i>Being self employed has its <b>upside</b>.</i>
