inadequacy

Lack of an adequate quantity or number.

Her feelings of personal **inadequacy**.

injury

An act that causes someone or something to receive physical damage.

An ankle **injury**.

insufficiency The inability of an organ to perform its normal function.

Insufficiency of adequate housing.

misconceive Interpret in the wrong way.

Some academic latinists did **misconceive** Pound s poem in that way.

A disagreement or quarrel.
