altruism	The quality of unselfish concern for the welfare of others. <i>Reciprocal altruism</i> .
benefaction	An act intending or showing kindness and good will. An exceptional <b>benefaction</b> .
<u>benevolence</u>	An inclination to do kind or charitable acts.
caring	The work or practice of looking after those unable to care for themselves, especially on account of age or illness. <i>Caring friends</i> .
compassionate	Showing or having compassion. I allowed him to go home on <b>compassionate</b> grounds.
condolence	An expression of sympathy with another's grief. <i>They sent their <b>condolence</b>s.</i>
considerateness	Kind and considerate regard for others.
empathize	Understand and share the feelings of another. Counsellors need to be able to <b>empathize</b> with people.
empathy	Understanding and entering into another's feelings.
<u>forgiving</u>	Inclined or able to forgive and show mercy. A kindly <b>forgiving</b> nature.
<u>generosity</u>	Acting generously. <i>I was overwhelmed by the generosity of friends and neighbours.</i>
goodwill	The friendly hope that something will succeed. A <b>goodwill</b> gesture.
kindness	A kind act. It would be a <b>kindness</b> on your part to invite her.
loving	Enjoying the specified activity or thing. <i>Loving</i> glances.



mawkish	Sentimental in an exaggerated or false way. The <b>mawkish</b> smell of warm beer.
melodrama	Behaviour or events that resemble melodrama. What little is known of his early life is cloaked in <b>melodrama</b> .
merciful	(of an event) coming as a mercy; bringing someone relief from something unpleasant. A <b>merciful</b> god.
<u>pathetic</u>	Relating to the emotions. <i>He s a <b>pathetic</b> excuse for a man.</i>
<u>pathos</u>	A feeling of sympathy and sorrow for the misfortunes of others. The film captured all the <b>pathos</b> of their situation.
pity	Share the suffering of. It s a <b>pity</b> he couldn t do it.
regretful	Feeling or expressing regret or sorrow or a sense of loss over something done or undone. <i>He sounded</i> <b>regretful</b> <i>but pointed out that he had committed himself.</i>
regrettable	(of conduct or an event) giving rise to regret; undesirable; unwelcome. <i>The loss of this number of jobs is <b>regrettable</b>.</i>
ruth	A book of the Old Testament that tells the story of Ruth who was not an Israelite but who married an Israelite and who stayed with her mother- in-law Naomi after her husband died.
sadness	The quality of excessive mournfulness and uncheerfulness. <i>A source of great sadness</i> .
selflessness	The quality of unselfish concern for the welfare of others. A noble act of <b>selflessness</b> .
sentimentality	Exaggerated and self-indulgent tenderness, sadness, or nostalgia. There are passages which verge on <b>sentimentality</b> .
<u>sympathetic</u>	Evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings. <i>Hubbell is a more <b>sympathetic</b> character.</i>
<u>sympathy</u>	Sharing the feelings of others (especially feelings of sorrow or anguish. <i>The magnetic field oscillates in sympathy.</i>
telepathy	Apparent communication from one mind to another without using sensory perceptions.
understanding	Characterized by understanding based on comprehension and discernment and empathy. <i>A kind and <b>understanding</b> man.</i>
