altruism	The quality of unselfish concern for the welfare of others. <i>Reciprocal altruism.</i>
benefaction	An act intending or showing kindness and good will. <i>An exceptional benefaction.</i>
benevolence	An inclination to do kind or charitable acts.
caring	The work or practice of looking after those unable to care for themselves, especially on account of age or illness. <i>Caring friends.</i>
compassionate	Showing or having compassion. <i>I allowed him to go home on compassionate grounds.</i>
condolence	An expression of sympathy with another’s grief. <i>They sent their condolences.</i>
considerateness	Kind and considerate regard for others.
empathize	Understand and share the feelings of another. <i>Counsellors need to be able to empathize with people.</i>
empathy	Understanding and entering into another’s feelings.
forgiving	Inclined or able to forgive and show mercy. <i>A kindly forgiving nature.</i>
generosity	Acting generously. <i>I was overwhelmed by the generosity of friends and neighbours.</i>
goodwill	The friendly hope that something will succeed. <i>A goodwill gesture.</i>
kindness	A kind act. <i>It would be a kindness on your part to invite her.</i>
loving	Enjoying the specified activity or thing. <i>Loving glances.</i>

mawkish	Sentimental in an exaggerated or false way. <i>The mawkish smell of warm beer.</i>
melodrama	Behaviour or events that resemble melodrama. <i>What little is known of his early life is cloaked in melodrama.</i>
merciful	(of an event) coming as a mercy; bringing someone relief from something unpleasant. <i>A merciful god.</i>
pathetic	Relating to the emotions. <i>He s a pathetic excuse for a man.</i>
pathos	A feeling of sympathy and sorrow for the misfortunes of others. <i>The film captured all the pathos of their situation.</i>
pity	Share the suffering of. <i>It s a pity he couldn t do it.</i>
regretful	Feeling or expressing regret or sorrow or a sense of loss over something done or undone. <i>He sounded regretful but pointed out that he had committed himself.</i>
regrettable	(of conduct or an event) giving rise to regret; undesirable; unwelcome. <i>The loss of this number of jobs is regrettable.</i>
ruth	A book of the Old Testament that tells the story of Ruth who was not an Israelite but who married an Israelite and who stayed with her mother-in-law Naomi after her husband died.
sadness	The quality of excessive mournfulness and uncheerfulness. <i>A source of great sadness.</i>
selflessness	The quality of unselfish concern for the welfare of others. <i>A noble act of selflessness.</i>
sentimentality	Exaggerated and self-indulgent tenderness, sadness, or nostalgia. <i>There are passages which verge on sentimentality.</i>
sympathetic	Evoking empathic or sympathetic feelings. <i>Hubbell is a more sympathetic character.</i>
sympathy	Sharing the feelings of others (especially feelings of sorrow or anguish). <i>The magnetic field oscillates in sympathy.</i>
telepathy	Apparent communication from one mind to another without using sensory perceptions.
understanding	Characterized by understanding based on comprehension and discernment and empathy. <i>A kind and understanding man.</i>
