<b>apparel</b>	Clothing in general. <i>All the vestments in which they used to <b>apparel</b> their Deities.</i>
<b>attire</b>	Clothes, especially fine or formal ones. <i>The usually sober <b>attire</b> of British security service personnel.</i>
<b>axiomatic</b>	Containing aphorisms or maxims. <i>1914 saw the first <b>axiomatic</b> declaration of exactly what constitutes a ring.</i>
<b>becoming</b>	Suitable or appropriate. <i>Do not talk too much to your cousins it s not <b>becoming</b>.</i>
<b>ceremonious</b>	Characterized by pomp and ceremony and stately display. <i>He accepted the gifts with <b>ceremonious</b> dignity.</i>
<b>chiffon</b>	(of a cake or dessert) made with beaten egg to give a light consistency. <i>A <b>chiffon</b> blouse.</i>
<b>clothing</b>	Clothes collectively. <i>Bring warm <b>clothing</b> and waterproofs.</i>
<b>corset</b>	Dress with a corset.
<b>courtly</b>	Refined or imposing in manner or appearance; befitting a royal court. <i>He gave a <b>courtly</b> bow.</i>
<b>cursor</b>	Hasty and therefore not thorough or detailed. <i>A casual or <b>cursor</b> inspection failed to reveal the house s structural flaws.</i>
<b>decorum</b>	Behaviour in keeping with good taste and propriety. <i>He had acted with the utmost <b>decorum</b>.</i>
<b>deductive</b>	Involving inferences from general principles. <i>I used my <b>deductive</b> powers.</i>
<b>dress</b>	Dress or groom with elaborate care. <i>She likes to <b>dress</b> when going to the opera.</i>

<b>etiquette</b>	The customary code of polite behaviour in society or among members of a particular profession or group. <i><b>Etiquette</b> books.</i>
<b>formality</b>	A thing that is done simply to comply with convention, regulations, or custom. <i>A mere <b>formality</b>.</i>
<b>manner</b>	A kind. <i>An adverb of <b>manner</b>.</i>
<b>mannered</b>	Having unnatural mannerisms. <i>Inane dialogue and <b>mannered</b> acting.</i>
<b>method</b>	A way of doing something, especially a systematic way; implies an orderly logical arrangement (usually in steps). <i>A <b>method</b> for software maintenance.</i>
<b>negligee</b>	A woman's light dressing gown, typically made of a filmy, soft fabric. <i>A black silk <b>negligee</b>.</i>
<b>nightgown</b>	A dressing gown.
<b>nominal</b>	Expressed in terms of current prices or figures, without making allowance for changes over time. <i>The <b>nominal</b> exchange rate.</i>
<a href="#"><u>outfit</u></a>	A complete set of equipment needed for a particular purpose. <i>Warders <b>outfitted</b> in special suits.</i>
<a href="#"><u>perfunctory</u></a>	Done or produced as a formality only. <i>He gave a <b>perfunctory</b> nod.</i>
<a href="#"><u>pretense</u></a>	Pretending with intention to deceive.
<b>procedural</b>	Relating to an established or official way of doing something. <i>The developers had complied with all the relevant <b>procedural</b> requirements.</i>
<b>raiment</b>	Clothing. <i>Ladies clothed in <b>raiment</b> bedecked with jewels.</i>
<b>sandal</b>	A light shoe with either an openwork upper or straps attaching the sole to the foot. <i>They were dressed in open toed <b>sandals</b>.</i>
<b>sartorial</b>	Of or relating to a tailor or to tailoring. <i><b>Sartorial</b> elegance.</i>
<a href="#"><u>stately</u></a>	Refined or imposing in manner or appearance; befitting a royal court. <i>A <b>stately</b> 19th century mansion.</i>

**titular**

(of a cleric) nominally appointed to serve a diocese, abbey, or other foundation no longer in existence, and typically in fact having authority in another capacity.

*The nominal or **titular** head of his party.*
