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Associations of "For formal" (30 Words)

apparel	Clothing in general. <i>All the vestments in which they used to apparel their Deities.</i>
attire	Clothes, especially fine or formal ones. <i>The usually sober attire of British security service personnel.</i>
axiomatic	Containing aphorisms or maxims. <i>1914 saw the first axiomatic declaration of exactly what constitutes a ring.</i>
becoming	Suitable or appropriate. <i>Do not talk too much to your cousins it s not becoming.</i>
ceremonious	Characterized by pomp and ceremony and stately display. <i>He accepted the gifts with ceremonious dignity.</i>
chiffon	(of a cake or dessert) made with beaten egg to give a light consistency. <i>A chiffon blouse.</i>
clothing	Clothes collectively. <i>Bring warm clothing and waterproofs.</i>
corset	Dress with a corset.
courtly	Refined or imposing in manner or appearance; befitting a royal court. <i>He gave a courtly bow.</i>
cursor	Hasty and therefore not thorough or detailed. <i>A casual or cursor inspection failed to reveal the house s structural flaws.</i>
decorum	Behaviour in keeping with good taste and propriety. <i>He had acted with the utmost decorum.</i>
deductive	Involving inferences from general principles. <i>I used my deductive powers.</i>
dress	Dress or groom with elaborate care. <i>She likes to dress when going to the opera.</i>

etiquette	The customary code of polite behaviour in society or among members of a particular profession or group. <i>Etiquette books.</i>
formality	A thing that is done simply to comply with convention, regulations, or custom. <i>A mere formality.</i>
manner	A kind. <i>An adverb of manner.</i>
mannered	Having unnatural mannerisms. <i>Inane dialogue and mannered acting.</i>
method	A way of doing something, especially a systematic way; implies an orderly logical arrangement (usually in steps). <i>A method for software maintenance.</i>
negligee	A woman's light dressing gown, typically made of a filmy, soft fabric. <i>A black silk negligee.</i>
nightgown	A dressing gown.
nominal	Expressed in terms of current prices or figures, without making allowance for changes over time. <i>The nominal exchange rate.</i>
<u>outfit</u>	A complete set of equipment needed for a particular purpose. <i>Warders outfitted in special suits.</i>
<u>perfunctory</u>	Done or produced as a formality only. <i>He gave a perfunctory nod.</i>
<u>pretense</u>	Pretending with intention to deceive.
procedural	Relating to an established or official way of doing something. <i>The developers had complied with all the relevant procedural requirements.</i>
raiment	Clothing. <i>Ladies clothed in raiment bedecked with jewels.</i>
sandal	A light shoe with either an openwork upper or straps attaching the sole to the foot. <i>They were dressed in open toed sandals.</i>
sartorial	Of or relating to a tailor or to tailoring. <i>Sartorial elegance.</i>
<u>stately</u>	Refined or imposing in manner or appearance; befitting a royal court. <i>A stately 19th century mansion.</i>

titular

(of a cleric) nominally appointed to serve a diocese, abbey, or other foundation no longer in existence, and typically in fact having authority in another capacity.

*The nominal or **titular** head of his party.*
