Associations of "For frightening" (30 Words)

<u>afraid</u>	Unwilling or reluctant to do something for fear of the consequences. <i>Afraid to show emotion.</i>
<u>alarming</u>	Worrying or disturbing. <i>Our countryside is disappearing at an alarming rate.</i>
appall	Strike with disgust or revulsion.
<u>chilling</u>	The process of becoming cooler; a falling temperature. <i>A chilling account of the prisoners fate.</i>
claustrophobia	A morbid fear of being closed in a confined space. <i>The small stuffy room had begun to give him claustrophobia.</i>
<u>dread</u>	Dreadlocks. <i>The band appeals to dreads and baldheads alike.</i>
<u>dreadful</u>	Very unpleasant. <i>Don t go out the weather is dreadful.</i>
fear	Be uneasy or apprehensive about. <i>He urged his listeners to fear God.</i>
fearful	Experiencing or showing fear. <i>Cast fearful glances at the large dog.</i>
fearfulness	An emotion experienced in anticipation of some specific pain or danger (usually accompanied by a desire to flee or fight.
fearsome	Frightening, especially in appearance. <i>The cat mewed displaying a fearsome set of teeth.</i>
<u>formidable</u>	Inspiring fear- G.H.Johnston. <i>The formidable prospect of major surgery.</i>
fright	Frighten. <i>I jumped up in fright.</i>
frighten	Drive out by frightening. <i>Farmers are being frightened into scaling down their breeding plans.</i>

frightful	Very unpleasant, serious, or shocking. <i>There s been a most frightful accident.</i>
<u>gruesome</u>	Extremely unpleasant. <i>Gruesome evidence of human sacrifice.</i>
hideous	Extremely ugly. <i>Hideous lizard like creatures.</i>
<u>horrific</u>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>Horrific conditions in the mining industry.</i>
<u>horror</u>	A thing causing a feeling of horror. <i>That little horror Zach was around.</i>
<u>macabre</u>	Disturbing because concerned with or causing a fear of death. <i>A macabre series of murders.</i>
<u>panic</u>	Feel or cause to feel panic. <i>The mere thought of an isolation cell panicked the prisoners.</i>
petrify	Cause to become stonelike or stiff or dazed and stunned. <i>Slogans petrify our thinking.</i>
<u>scare</u>	Become scared. <i>Recent food scares have made the public rightly sensitive to new apparently untested technologies.</i>
scared	Fearful; frightened. <i>Too shocked and scared to move.</i>
scary	Uncannily striking or surprising. <i>A scary movie.</i>
<u>spooky</u>	Sinister or ghostly in a way that causes fear and unease. <i>Some horses are more spooky by nature than others.</i>
terrible	Extremely bad or serious. <i>A terrible curse.</i>
terrify	Fill with terror; frighten greatly. <i>The thought terrifies me.</i>
<u>terrifying</u>	Causing extreme terror. <i>A terrifying wail.</i>
terror	Terrorism. <i>His delivery is the terror of even world class batsmen.</i>
