## Associations of "For guiding" (30 Words)

<b>antimony</b>	The chemical element of atomic number 51, a brittle silvery-white metalloid.
<b>asterisk</b>	Mark a word or piece of text with an asterisk. <i>He had <b>asterisked</b> the things about the case that still bothered him.</i>
<b>bookmark</b>	A marker (a piece of paper or ribbon) placed between the pages of a book to mark the reader's place. <i>Fans will want to <b>bookmark</b> this site.</i>
<b>catalog</b>	Make a catalogue compile a catalogue. <i>It does not pretend to be a <b>catalog</b> of his achievements.</i>
<b>catalogue</b>	Enter an item in a catalogue. <i>A mail order <b>catalogue</b>.</i>
<b>clue</b>	Inform someone about a particular matter. <i>Archaeological evidence can give <b>clues</b> about the past.</i>
<b>connotation</b>	An idea or feeling which a word invokes for a person in addition to its literal or primary meaning. <i>The work functions both by analogy and by <b>connotation</b>.</i>
<b>cue</b>	Give a cue to or for. <i>She had not yet been given her <b>cue</b> to come out on to the dais.</i>
<b>denotation</b>	The act of indicating or pointing out by name. <i>Beyond their immediate <b>denotation</b> the words have a connotative power.</i>
<b>diacritical</b>	Capable of distinguishing.
<b>directive</b>	Involving the management or guidance of operations. <i>The boss loves to send us <b>directives</b>.</i>
<b>handbook</b>	A book giving information such as facts on a particular subject or instructions for operating a machine. <i>A <b>handbook</b> of poisonous plants.</i>
<b>hint</b>	Drop a hint intimate by a hint. <i>Randall smiled with a <b>hint</b> of mockery.</i>

<b>index</b>	Adjust through indexation. <i>Clear cross references supplemented by a thorough <b>index</b>.</i>
<b>indicant</b>	A thing which indicates something. <i>Symptoms are the prime <b>indicants</b> of disease.</i>
<b>indication</b>	A sign or piece of information that indicates something. <i><b>Indications</b> of strain.</i>
<b>key</b>	Enter or operate on data by means of a computer keyboard or telephone keypad. <i>He hit another jumper from the top of the <b>key</b>.</i>
<b>label</b>	Assign a label to designate with a label. <i>These students were <b>labelled</b> learning disabled.</i>
<b>lead</b>	Lead extend or afford access. <i>The children were playing with <b>lead</b> soldiers.</i>
<b>leading</b>	The activity of leading. <i>The country's <b>leading</b> poet.</i>
<b>mark</b>	Designate as if by a mark. <i>They figure I'm an easy <b>mark</b>.</i>
<b>principle</b>	An explanation of the fundamental reasons (especially an explanation of the working of some device in terms of laws of nature). <i>She resigned over a matter of <b>principle</b>.</i>
<b>sign</b>	Indicate with signposts or other markers. <i>She <b>signed</b> the letter and sent it off.</i>
<b>signpost</b>	Mark with a signpost as of a path. <i>Most of the walks were well <b>signposted</b>.</i>
<b>solder</b>	Join with solder. <i>The <b>soldered</b> terminal joints.</i>
<b>suggestion</b>	An idea or belief accepted by a person as a result of suggestion. <i>It was a <b>suggestion</b> we couldn't refuse.</i>
<b>symptom</b>	Any sensation or change in bodily function that is experienced by a patient and is associated with a particular disease. <i>The government was plagued by leaks a <b>symptom</b> of divisions and poor morale.</i>
<b>tab</b>	Identify as being of a specified type or suitable for a specified position. <i>Pull the <b>tab</b> to open the can.</i>
<b>tag</b>	Attach a tag or label to. <i>Mothers suspected that their babies had been wrongly <b>tagged</b> during an alarm at the hospital.</i>
