antimony	The chemical element of atomic number 51, a brittle silvery-white metalloid.
asterisk	Mark a word or piece of text with an asterisk. <i>He had asterisked the things about the case that still bothered him.</i>
bookmark	A marker (a piece of paper or ribbon) placed between the pages of a book to mark the reader's place. <i>Fans will want to bookmark this site.</i>
catalog	Make a catalogue compile a catalogue. <i>It does not pretend to be a catalog of his achievements.</i>
catalogue	Enter an item in a catalogue. <i>A mail order catalogue.</i>
clue	Inform someone about a particular matter. <i>Archaeological evidence can give clues about the past.</i>
connotation	An idea or feeling which a word invokes for a person in addition to its literal or primary meaning. <i>The work functions both by analogy and by connotation.</i>
cue	Give a cue to or for. <i>She had not yet been given her cue to come out on to the dais.</i>
denotation	The act of indicating or pointing out by name. <i>Beyond their immediate denotation the words have a connotative power.</i>
diacritical	Capable of distinguishing.
directive	Involving the management or guidance of operations. <i>The boss loves to send us directives.</i>
handbook	A book giving information such as facts on a particular subject or instructions for operating a machine. <i>A handbook of poisonous plants.</i>
hint	Drop a hint intimate by a hint. <i>Randall smiled with a hint of mockery.</i>

index	Adjust through indexation. <i>Clear cross references supplemented by a thorough index.</i>
indicant	A thing which indicates something. <i>Symptoms are the prime indicants of disease.</i>
indication	A sign or piece of information that indicates something. <i>Indications of strain.</i>
key	Enter or operate on data by means of a computer keyboard or telephone keypad. <i>He hit another jumper from the top of the key.</i>
label	Assign a label to designate with a label. <i>These students were labelled learning disabled.</i>
lead	Lead extend or afford access. <i>The children were playing with lead soldiers.</i>
leading	The activity of leading. <i>The country's leading poet.</i>
mark	Designate as if by a mark. <i>They figure I'm an easy mark.</i>
principle	An explanation of the fundamental reasons (especially an explanation of the working of some device in terms of laws of nature). <i>She resigned over a matter of principle.</i>
sign	Indicate with signposts or other markers. <i>She signed the letter and sent it off.</i>
signpost	Mark with a signpost as of a path. <i>Most of the walks were well signposted.</i>
solder	Join with solder. <i>The soldered terminal joints.</i>
suggestion	An idea or belief accepted by a person as a result of suggestion. <i>It was a suggestion we couldn't refuse.</i>
symptom	Any sensation or change in bodily function that is experienced by a patient and is associated with a particular disease. <i>The government was plagued by leaks a symptom of divisions and poor morale.</i>
tab	Identify as being of a specified type or suitable for a specified position. <i>Pull the tab to open the can.</i>
tag	Attach a tag or label to. <i>Mothers suspected that their babies had been wrongly tagged during an alarm at the hospital.</i>
