acquire	Win something through one’s efforts. <i>You must acquire the rudiments of Greek.</i>
achievement	The action of acquiring something. <i>The achievement of self control.</i>
approbation	Official recognition or approval. <i>A term of approbation.</i>
attainable	Capable of being attained or accomplished. <i>Yields in excess of 6 are easily attainable.</i>
belong	Be rightly assigned to a specified category. <i>She is a stranger and doesn t belong here.</i>
checkbook	A book issued to holders of checking accounts.
earn	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>He earns his living as a lorry driver.</i>
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>The dog fetches the hat.</i>
grab	Denoting a bar or strap for people to hold on to for support or in a moving vehicle. <i>A grab rail.</i>
hold	Contain or hold have within. <i>She holds a Master s degree from Harvard.</i>
holder	A smallholder. <i>A towel holder.</i>
host	A person who acts as host at formal occasions makes an introductory speech and introduces other speakers. <i>We hosted 4 couples last night.</i>
incur	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>I will pay any expenses incurred.</i>

landlady	A woman who rents out land, a building, or accommodation.
landlord	A man (in legal use also a woman) who rents out land, a building, or accommodation.
let	Allow someone to have the use of (a room or property) in return for regular payments. <i>The tiny window let in hardly any light.</i>
obtain	Receive a specified treatment (abstract). <i>How did you obtain the visa.</i>
own	Have something as one's own possess. <i>His father owns a restaurant.</i>
owner	Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business. <i>Who is the owner of that friendly smile.</i>
permission	The act of giving a formal (usually written) authorization. <i>He asked permission to leave.</i>
possess	Have ownership or possession of. <i>All that the plaintiffs did was to possess themselves of the securities.</i>
possession	Something that is owned or possessed. <i>They said prayers to protect the people inside the hall from demonic possession.</i>
possessor	A person who owns something. <i>His father was the possessor of a considerable fortune.</i>
procure	Persuade or cause (someone) to do something. <i>He procured extra cigarettes even though they were rationed.</i>
property	Shares or investments in property. <i>He's expanding now buying property.</i>
proprietor	The owner of a business, or a holder of property. <i>By 1640 he was himself the proprietor of a three hundred acre tract.</i>
regain	Get or find back; recover the use of. <i>She regained control of herself.</i>
rent	Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services. <i>We rented our apartment to friends while we were abroad.</i>
retention	The action of absorbing and continuing to hold a substance. <i>The soil's retention of moisture.</i>
take	Take on a certain form attribute or aspect. <i>Some degrees require a student to take a secondary subject.</i>
