acquire	Take on a certain form, attribute, or aspect. <i>Children acquire language at an amazing rate.</i>
acquirement	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>The acquirement of self control.</i>
approbation	Official approval. <i>A term of approbation.</i>
attainable	Able to be attained; achievable. <i>Yields in excess of 6 are easily attainable.</i>
belong	(of a thing) be rightly placed in a specified position. <i>The vehicle did not belong to him.</i>
checkbook	A book issued to holders of checking accounts.
earn	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>He earns his living as a lorry driver.</i>
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>The devil will fetch you.</i>
grab	Make a grasping or snatching motion with the hand. <i>How does that grab you.</i>
hold	Have or hold in one s hands or grip. <i>The flask holds one gallon.</i>
holder	A smallholder. <i>I replaced the phone in its holder.</i>
host	Be the host of or for. <i>They were always gracious hosts at the numerous dinner parties they held for friends.</i>
incur	Make oneself subject to; bring upon oneself; become liable to. <i>People who smoke incur a great danger to their health.</i>
landlady	A woman who keeps lodgings, a boarding house, or a pub.

landlord	A landowner who leases to others. Used as a polite way of making or responding to a suggestion, giving an instruction, or introducing a remark. <i>I've taken a month's let on the flat.</i>

obtain	Be valid, applicable, or true. <i>The price of silver fell to that obtaining elsewhere in the ancient world.</i>
own	Have ownership or possession of. <i>His father owns a restaurant.</i>
owner	A person who owns something. <i>He is the owner of a chain of restaurants.</i>
permission	Approval to do something. <i>Permissions to reproduce copyright material.</i>
possess	Have ownership or possession of. <i>He did not possess a sense of humour.</i>
possession	Something that is owned or possessed. <i>The landlord wishes to gain possession of the accommodation.</i>
possessor	A person who owns something or has a particular quality. <i>His father was the possessor of a considerable fortune.</i>
procure	Obtain (something), especially with care or effort. <i>He persuaded a friend to procure him a ticket.</i>
property	Shares or investments in property. <i>That hat is my property.</i>
proprietor	(law) someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business. <i>Chinese restaurant proprietors.</i>
regain	Get or find back; recover the use of. <i>She regained control of herself.</i>
rent	Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services. <i>I cannot even afford to pay the rent on this flat.</i>
retention	The act of retaining something. <i>The children's retention of facts.</i>
take	Be designed to hold or take. <i>Let's take Napoleon for instance.</i>
