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## Associations of "For has" (30 Words)

<b>acquire</b>	Take on a certain form, attribute, or aspect. <i>Children <b>acquire</b> language at an amazing rate.</i>
<b>acquirement</b>	An ability that has been acquired by training. <i>The <b>acquirement</b> of self control.</i>
<b>approbation</b>	Official approval. <i>A term of <b>approbation</b>.</i>
<b>attainable</b>	Able to be attained; achievable. <i>Yields in excess of 6 are easily <b>attainable</b>.</i>
<b>belong</b>	(of a thing) be rightly placed in a specified position. <i>The vehicle did not <b>belong</b> to him.</i>
<b>checkbook</b>	A book issued to holders of checking accounts.
<b>earn</b>	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>He <b>earns</b> his living as a lorry driver.</i>
<b>fetch</b>	The action of fetching. <i>The devil will <b>fetch</b> you.</i>
<b>grab</b>	Make a grasping or snatching motion with the hand. <i>How does that <b>grab</b> you.</i>
<b>hold</b>	Have or hold in one s hands or grip. <i>The flask <b>holds</b> one gallon.</i>
<b>holder</b>	A smallholder. <i>I replaced the phone in its <b>holder</b>.</i>
<b>host</b>	Be the host of or for. <i>They were always gracious <b>hosts</b> at the numerous dinner parties they held for friends.</i>
<b>incur</b>	Make oneself subject to; bring upon oneself; become liable to. <i>People who smoke <b>incur</b> a great danger to their health.</i>
<b>landlady</b>	A woman who keeps lodgings, a boarding house, or a pub.

<b>landlord</b>	A landowner who leases to others. Used as a polite way of making or responding to a suggestion, giving an instruction, or introducing a remark. <i>I've taken a month's <b>let</b> on the flat.</i>

<b>obtain</b>	Be valid, applicable, or true. <i>The price of silver fell to that <b>obtaining</b> elsewhere in the ancient world.</i>
<b>own</b>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>His father <b>owns</b> a restaurant.</i>
<b>owner</b>	A person who owns something. <i>He is the <b>owner</b> of a chain of restaurants.</i>
<b>permission</b>	Approval to do something. <i><b>Permissions</b> to reproduce copyright material.</i>
<b>possess</b>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>He did not <b>possess</b> a sense of humour.</i>
<b>possession</b>	Something that is owned or possessed. <i>The landlord wishes to gain <b>possession</b> of the accommodation.</i>
<b>possessor</b>	A person who owns something or has a particular quality. <i>His father was the <b>possessor</b> of a considerable fortune.</i>
<b>procure</b>	Obtain (something), especially with care or effort. <i>He persuaded a friend to <b>procure</b> him a ticket.</i>
<b>property</b>	Shares or investments in property. <i>That hat is my <b>property</b>.</i>
<b>proprietor</b>	(law) someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business. <i>Chinese restaurant <b>proprietors</b>.</i>
<b>regain</b>	Get or find back; recover the use of. <i>She <b>regained</b> control of herself.</i>
<b>rent</b>	Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services. <i>I cannot even afford to pay the <b>rent</b> on this flat.</i>
<b>retention</b>	The act of retaining something. <i>The children's <b>retention</b> of facts.</i>
<b>take</b>	Be designed to hold or take. <i>Let's <b>take</b> Napoleon for instance.</i>
