acquire	Win something through one's efforts. <i>I acquired a strong aversion to television.</i>
acquisition	The action of acquiring something. <i>The acquisition of self control.</i>
approbation	Approval or praise. <i>A term of approbation.</i>
attainable	Capable of being attained or accomplished. <i>Yields in excess of 6 are easily attainable.</i>
belong	(of a contest or period of time) be dominated by. <i>These pages don't belong.</i>
checkbook	A book issued to holders of checking accounts.
earn	Earn on some commercial or business transaction earn as salary or wages. <i>She earns a lot in her new job.</i>
fetch	The action of fetching. <i>Kind offers fetched tears from me.</i>
grab	An act of obtaining something opportunistically or unscrupulously. <i>She grabbed the child's hand and ran out of the room.</i>
hold	Support or hold in a certain manner. <i>Hold in place.</i>
holder	A smallholder. <i>I replaced the phone in its holder.</i>
host	Be the host of or for. <i>Your host is Stuart Macmillan.</i>
incur	Make oneself subject to; bring upon oneself; become liable to. <i>I will pay any expenses incurred.</i>
landlady	A woman who keeps lodgings, a boarding house, or a pub.
landlord	A man who keeps lodgings, a boarding house, or a pub.

<u>let</u>	Award (a contract for a project) to an applicant. <i>An unfurnished let.</i>
obtain	Come into possession of. <i>The price of silver fell to that obtaining elsewhere in the ancient world.</i>
<u>own</u>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>His father owns a restaurant.</i>
<u>owner</u>	A person who owns something. <i>Who is the owner of that friendly smile.</i>
permission	The act of giving a formal (usually written) authorization. <i>They had entered the country without permission.</i>
<u>possess</u>	Have ownership or possession of. <i>A terrible rage possessed her.</i>
possession	Something that is owned or possessed. <i>They re charged with possession.</i>
possessor	A person who owns something or has a particular quality. <i>His father was the possessor of a considerable fortune.</i>
procure	Cause (something) to happen. <i>He procured extra cigarettes even though they were rationed.</i>
property	Shares or investments in property. <i>The president was concerned about the property across from the White House.</i>
<u>proprietor</u>	Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business. <i>By 1640 he was himself the proprietor of a three hundred acre tract.</i>
<u>regain</u>	Obtain possession or use of (something, typically a quality or ability) again after losing it. <i>She regained control of herself.</i>
rent	Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services. <i>Skis or snowboards rent for 60 80 for six days.</i>
<u>retention</u>	The continued possession, use, or control of something. <i>Eating too much salt can lead to fluid retention.</i>
take	Take by force. <i>Let s take Napoleon for instance.</i>
