possessor A person who owns something or has a particular quality.

His father was the **possessor** of a considerable fortune.

procure Cause (something) to happen.

He **procure**d extra cigarettes even though they were rationed.

Shares or investments in property.

property The president was concerned about the **property** across from the White

House.

proprietor Someone who owns (is legal possessor of) a business.

By 1640 he was himself the **proprietor** of a three hundred acre tract.

Obtain possession or use of (something, typically a quality or ability) again

regain after losing it.

She **regain**ed control of herself.

rent Hold under a lease or rental agreement of goods and services.

Skis or snowboards **rent** for 60 80 for six days.

retention The continued possession, use, or control of something.

Eating too much salt can lead to fluid **retention**.

Take by force.
