<b>extreme</b>	The highest or most extreme degree of something. <i>The <b>extreme</b> of applying for poor relief.</i>
<b>extremely</b>	To a very great degree; very. <i>This is an <b>extremely</b> difficult thing to do.</i>
<b><a href="#">fierce</a></b>	Ruthless in competition. <i>The <b>fierce</b> thunders roar me their music.</i>
<b>forceful</b>	Forceful and definite in expression or action. <i>A <b>forceful</b> personality.</i>
<b>hard</b>	Unfortunate or hard to bear. <i>Had <b>hard</b> luck.</i>
<b>immensely</b>	To an exceedingly great extent or degree. <i>The president was <b>immensely</b> popular.</i>
<b>immoderate</b>	Beyond reasonable limits. <i><b>Immoderate</b> drinking.</i>
<b><a href="#">impetus</a></b>	A force that moves something along. <i>Hit the booster coil before the flywheel loses all its <b>impetus</b>.</i>
<b>influence</b>	Shape or influence give direction to. <i>She was the most important <b>influence</b> in my life.</i>

<b>intemperate</b>	Given to or characterized by excessive indulgence, especially in alcohol. <i>An <b>intemperate</b> climate.</i>
<b>intense</b>	Extremely sharp or intense. <i><b>Intense</b> anxiety.</i>
<b>irresistible</b>	Too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i><b>Irresistible</b> beauty.</i>
<b>overwhelming</b>	Very intense. <i>His party won <b>overwhelming</b> support.</i>
<b>powerful</b>	Of a person possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i><b>Powerful</b> arms.</i>
<b>rely</b>	Be dependent on. <i>The charity has to <b>rely</b> entirely on public donations.</i>
<b>rushing</b>	(of a player) advancing rapidly towards an opposing player, especially the quarterback. <i>They have a really good offensive line as far as <b>rushing</b> is concerned.</i>
<b>severe</b>	Severely simple. <i>A <b>severe</b> test of stamina.</i>
<b>strong</b>	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>Cotton is <b>strong</b> hard wearing and easy to handle.</i>
<b>super</b>	Superfine fabric or manufacture. <i>A <b>super</b> party.</i>
<b>ultimate</b>	Denoting the maximum possible strength or resistance beyond which an object breaks. <i>The <b>ultimate</b> achievement.</i>
<b>unabated</b>	Continuing at full strength or intensity. <i>The popularity of his books among young people continued <b>unabated</b>.</i>
<b>unbearably</b>	In a way that is impossible or extremely hard to endure. <i>Even the nights were <b>unbearably</b> hot.</i>
<b>uncommonly</b>	Exceptionally; very. <i>He is an <b>uncommonly</b> good talker.</i>
<b>utmost</b>	Most remote in space or time or order. <i><b>Utmost</b> contempt.</i>
<b>vehemence</b>	Intensity or forcefulness of expression. <i>The <b>vehemence</b> of his reaction.</i>
<b>vehement</b>	Characterized by great force or energy. <i><b>Vehement</b> deluges of rain.</i>
