extremely	To a very great degree; very. <i>This is an extremely difficult thing to do.</i>
fierce	Ruthless in competition. <i>The fierce thunders roar me their music.</i>
forceful	Forceful and definite in expression or action. <i>A forceful personality.</i>
hard	Unfortunate or hard to bear. <i>Had hard luck.</i>
immensely	To an exceedingly great extent or degree. <i>The president was immensely popular.</i>
immoderate	Beyond reasonable limits. <i>Immoderate drinking.</i>
impetus	A force that moves something along. <i>Hit the booster coil before the flywheel loses all its impetus.</i>
influence	Shape or influence give direction to. <i>She was the most important influence in my life.</i>

intemperate	Given to or characterized by excessive indulgence, especially in alcohol. <i>An intemperate climate.</i>
intense	Extremely sharp or intense. <i>Intense anxiety.</i>
irresistible	Too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i>Irresistible beauty.</i>
overwhelming	Very intense. <i>His party won overwhelming support.</i>
powerful	Of a person possessing physical strength and weight rugged and powerful. <i>Powerful arms.</i>
rely	Be dependent on. <i>The charity has to rely entirely on public donations.</i>
rushing	(of a player) advancing rapidly towards an opposing player, especially the quarterback. <i>They have a really good offensive line as far as rushing is concerned.</i>
severe	Severely simple. <i>A severe test of stamina.</i>
strong	Having a strong physiological or chemical effect. <i>Cotton is strong hard wearing and easy to handle.</i>
super	Superfine fabric or manufacture. <i>A super party.</i>
ultimate	Denoting the maximum possible strength or resistance beyond which an object breaks. <i>The ultimate achievement.</i>
unabated	Continuing at full strength or intensity. <i>The popularity of his books among young people continued unabated.</i>
unbearably	In a way that is impossible or extremely hard to endure. <i>Even the nights were unbearably hot.</i>
uncommonly	Exceptionally; very. <i>He is an uncommonly good talker.</i>
utmost	Most remote in space or time or order. <i>Utmost contempt.</i>
vehemence	Intensity or forcefulness of expression. <i>The vehemence of his reaction.</i>
vehement	Characterized by great force or energy. <i>Vehement deluges of rain.</i>
