## Associations of "For indeed" (30 Words)

<b>absolutely</b>	Used to emphasize a strong or exaggerated statement. <i>White collar crime increased both <b>absolutely</b> and in comparison with other categories.</i>
<a href="#">actual</a>	Being or reflecting the essential or genuine character of something. <i>Using <b>actual</b> income to measure expected income.</i>
<a href="#">actuality</a>	The state of actually existing objectively. <i>A hope that progressed from possibility to <b>actuality</b>.</i>
<b>actually</b>	As the truth or facts of a situation; really. <i>We must pay attention to what young people are <b>actually</b> doing.</i>
<a href="#">assuredly</a>	Without a doubt. <i>Potted roses will most <b>assuredly</b> not survive winter without protection.</i>
<a href="#">authentic</a>	Based on facts; accurate or reliable. <i>The letter is now accepted as an <b>authentic</b> document.</i>
<a href="#">certainly</a>	Used to indicate that a statement is made as a concession or contrasted with another. <i>The prestigious address <b>certainly</b> adds to the firm s appeal.</i>
<a href="#">certainty</a>	Firm conviction that something is the case. <i>He was expected to be a <b>certainty</b> for a gold medal.</i>
<b>certitude</b>	Something that someone firmly believes is true. <i>The question may never be answered with <b>certitude</b>.</i>
<b>cyberspace</b>	A computer network consisting of a worldwide network of computer networks that use the TCP/IP network protocols to facilitate data transmission and exchange. <i>I stayed in <b>cyberspace</b> for just a few minutes.</i>
<a href="#">doubtless</a>	Without doubt; certainly. <i><b>Doubtless</b> you ll solve the problem.</i>

<b>fact</b>	A thing that is known or proved to be true. <i>Even the most inventive journalism peters out without <b>facts</b> and in this case there were no <b>facts</b>.</i>
<b>genuinely</b>	Genuinely with authority. <i>It is <b>genuinely</b> an honour to be on the campaign.</i>
<b>indubitably</b>	In a manner or to a degree that could not be doubted. <i><b>Indubitably</b> liberalism parades under many guises.</i>
<b>literally</b>	Used for emphasis while not being literally true. <i>Tiramisu <b>literally</b> translated pull me up.</i>
<b>obviously</b>	In a way that is easily perceived or understood; clearly. <i>She was <b>obviously</b> unwell.</i>
<b>practical</b>	Guided by practical experience and observation rather than theory. <i><b>Practical</b> mathematics.</i>
<b>practically</b>	Almost; nearly. <i>The law isn't unreasonable or <b>practically</b> inconvenient.</i>
<b>real</b>	Really very. <i>Julius Caesar was a <b>real</b> person.</i>
<b>realism</b>	The doctrine that universals or abstract concepts have an objective or absolute existence The theory that universals have their own reality is sometimes called Platonic realism because it was first outlined by Plato's doctrine of forms or ideas. <i>British soaps will stay because of their gritty <b>realism</b>.</i>
<b>realistic</b>	Representing what is real; not abstract or ideal. <i>A <b>realistic</b> human drama.</i>
<b>reality</b>	Relating to reality TV. <i>He refuses to face <b>reality</b>.</i>
<b>really</b>	Used as intensifiers real is sometimes used informally for really rattling is informal. <i>I'm sorry Ruth I <b>really</b> am.</i>
<b>sooth</b>	Truth. <i>In <b>sooth</b>.</i>
<b>surely</b>	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>If he did not heed the warning he would <b>surely</b> die.</i>
<b>truly</b>	To the fullest degree; genuinely or properly. <i>We are <b>truly</b> sorry for the inconvenience.</i>

- truth** United States abolitionist and feminist who was freed from slavery and became a leading advocate of the abolition of slavery and for the rights of women (1797-1883).  
*The fundamental **truths** about mankind.*
- verily** Truly; certainly.  
*Trust in the Lord and **verily** thou shalt be fed.*
- verisimilitude** The appearance of being true or real.  
*The detail gives the novel some **verisimilitude**.*
- virtual** Denoting particles or interactions with extremely short lifetimes and (owing to the uncertainty principle) indefinitely great energies, postulated as intermediates in some processes.
