<u>certain</u>	Certain to occur destined or inevitable Benjamin Franklin. <i>It s certain that more changes are in the offing.</i>
constitutive	Having the power to establish or give organized existence to something. <i>Poverty is a constitutive element of a particular form of economic growth.</i>
crucial	Having crucial relevance. <i>Crucial information.</i>
essential	A thing that is absolutely necessary. <i>Funds essential to the completion of the project.</i>
important	Important in effect or meaning. <i>The speech had passion and more important compassion.</i>
importantly	Used to emphasize a significant point. <i>Kruger strutted forward importantly.</i>
indispensability	The quality possessed by something that you cannot possibly do without.
<u>indispensable</u>	Not to be dispensed with; essential. <i>He made himself indispensable to the parish priest.</i>
ineluctable	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>An ineluctable destiny.</i>
<u>inevitably</u>	By necessity. <i>Inevitably some details are already out of date.</i>
<u>insurmountable</u>	Too great to be overcome. <i>An insurmountable problem.</i>
<u>integral</u>	The result of a mathematical integration $F(x)$ is the integral of $f(x)$ if $dF/dx = f(x)$. <i>The unit comes complete with integral pump and heater.</i>
meaningful	Having a meaning or purpose. <i>Meaningful elements in a language.</i>

<u>must</u>	Used in ironic questions expressing irritation. <i>This video is a must for everyone.</i>
<u>necessarily</u>	In an essential manner. <i>It is necessarily so.</i>
necessary	(of a concept, statement, etc.) inevitably resulting from the nature of things, so that the contrary is impossible. <i>The necessary consequences of one's actions.</i>
necessity	The state of being unavoidable. <i>The necessity of providing parental guidance.</i>
need	Have or feel a need for. <i>Lest you even more than needs embitter our parting.</i>
needs	In such a manner as could not be otherwise. <i>We must needs by objective.</i>
<u>originally</u>	From or in the beginning; at first. <i>The suggestions so originally and persuasively outlined.</i>
perforce	By necessity; by force of circumstance. <i>Amateurs perforce have to settle for less expensive solutions.</i>
<u>prerequisite</u>	Something that is required in advance. <i>The student must have the prerequisite skills.</i>
required	Required by rule. <i>Eight editions were published each required reading for trainees.</i>
requisite	Anything indispensable. <i>She believed privacy to be a requisite for a peaceful life.</i>
<u>staple</u>	A piece of thin wire with two short right angled end pieces which are driven by a stapler through sheets of paper to fasten them together. <i>Merrill stapled a batch of papers together.</i>
<u>substantial</u>	Of or relating to the real nature or essential elements of something. <i>The wind was violent and felt substantial enough to lean against.</i>
<u>unavoidable</u>	Impossible to avoid or evade. <i>An unavoidable accident.</i>
<u>unconditional</u>	Not subject to any conditions. <i>Unconditional surrender.</i>
<u>underlying</u>	Lying or situated under something. <i>Underlying problems need to be addressed.</i>
<u>vital</u>	Absolutely necessary; essential. <i>Vital for a healthy society.</i>
