## Associations of "For inferior" (30 Words)

<b><u>abject</u></b>	Of the most contemptible kind. <i>An <b>abject</b> apology.</i>
<b>calibre</b>	The quality of someone’s character or the level of their ability. <i>Educational facilities of a very high <b>calibre</b>.</i>
<b><u>deficient</u></b>	Insufficient or inadequate. <i>The documentary evidence is <b>deficient</b>.</i>
<b><u>disadvantaged</u></b>	Marked by deprivation especially of the necessities of life or healthful environmental influences. <i><b>Disadvantaged</b> groups such as the unemployed.</i>
<b>hapless</b>	Deserving or inciting pity. <i>A <b>hapless</b> victim.</i>
<b><u>inadequate</u></b>	Lacking the quality or quantity required; insufficient for a purpose. <i>A sad solitary <b>inadequate</b> man.</i>
<b>inauspicious</b>	Not auspicious; boding ill. <i>This is the <b>inauspicious</b> star of disaster.</i>
<b><u>indigent</u></b>	Poor; needy. <i>A charity for the relief of <b>indigent</b> artists.</i>
<b>lacking</b>	Inadequate in amount or degree. <i>Adequate resources are sadly <b>lacking</b>.</i>
<b><u>meager</u></b>	Deficient in amount or quality or extent. <i><b>Meager</b> resources.</i>
<b>meagerly</b>	Deficient in amount or quality or extent. <i>These voices are <b>meagerly</b> represented at the conference.</i>
<b>measly</b>	Ridiculously small or few. <i>Three <b>measly</b> votes.</i>
<b>minus</b>	A disadvantage. <i><b>Minus</b> or negative factors.</i>

<b><u>miserable</u></b>	Miserly. <i>Their happiness made Anne feel even more <b>miserable</b>.</i>
<b><u>needy</u></b>	Needy people collectively. <i>The provision of humanitarian assistance to the <b>needy</b>.</i>
<b>paltry</b>	Not worth considering. <i>Naval glory struck him as <b>paltry</b>.</i>
<b><u>pathetic</u></b>	Deserving or inciting pity- Galsworthy. <i>She looked so <b>pathetic</b> that I bent down to comfort her.</i>
<b>pauper</b>	A poor person who may bring a legal action without payment of costs. <i>He died a <b>pauper</b>.</i>
<b>piteous</b>	Deserving or inciting pity- Galsworthy. <i>A <b>piteous</b> cry.</i>
<b>pitiable</b>	Deserving or inciting pity- Galsworthy. <i>The men were in a <b>pitiable</b> condition.</i>
<b><u>pitiful</u></b>	Compassionate. <i>A <b>pitiful</b> attempt to impress her.</i>
<b>scanty</b>	(of clothing) revealing the body. <i>The women looked cold in their <b>scanty</b> bodices.</i>
<b><u>scarce</u></b>	Scarcely. <i>Fresh vegetables were <b>scarce</b> during the drought.</i>
<b>substandard</b>	Falling short of some prescribed norm. <i><b>Substandard</b> spellings.</i>
<b>undermanned</b>	Inadequate in number of workers or assistants etc.
<b>undersized</b>	Of less than the usual size. <i>The <b>undersized</b> cubs may not survive the winter.</i>
<b><u>unfortunate</u></b>	A person who suffers bad fortune. <i>An <b>unfortunate</b> decision.</i>
<b>unlucky</b>	Marked by or promising bad fortune- W.H.Prescott. <i>The visitors were <b>unlucky</b> to have a goal disallowed.</i>
<b>wanting</b>	Not existing; absent. <i>Mandibles are <b>wanting</b> in many of these insects.</i>
<b>wretched</b>	Characterized by physical misery. <i>She disliked the <b>wretched</b> man intensely.</i>
