| <u>consistent</u> | Sometimes followed by with in agreement or consistent or reliable. <i>Testimony consistent with the known facts.</i> |
| constancy | The quality of being faithful and dependable. <i>The constancy of the tradition.</i> |
| constant | A number representing a quantity assumed to have a fixed value in a specified mathematical context. <i>Maintained a constant temperature.</i> |
| <u>durable</u> | Capable of withstanding wear and tear and decay. <i>Less durable rocks were gradually worn away to form valleys.</i> |
| <u>enduring</u> | Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble. <i>He formed a number of enduring relationships with women.</i> |
| <u>fatal</u> | Leading to failure or disaster. <i>It is fatal to enter any war without the will to win it.</i> |
| finality | The quality of being final or definitely settled. <i>The abrupt finality of death.</i> |

| fixed | Having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>A fixed iron ladder down the port side.</i> |
| immutable | Constant and unchanging. <i>The immutable laws of nature.</i> |
| indelible | (of ink or a pen) making marks that cannot be removed. <i>The story made an indelible impression on me.</i> |
| indestructible | Very long lasting. <i>Indestructible plastic containers.</i> |
| ineradicable | Unable to be destroyed or removed. <i>Ineradicable hostility.</i> |
| inseparable | A person or thing inseparable from another. <i>Inseparable pieces of rock.</i> |
| invariable | Not liable to or capable of change. <i>His invariable courtesy.</i> |
| irremediable | Impossible to cure or put right. <i>Irremediable marital breakdowns.</i> |
| irreparably | In an irreparable manner or to an irreparable degree. <i>Our international image has been irreparably tarnished.</i> |
| <u>lasting</u> | Lasting a long time without change. <i>They left a lasting impression.</i> |
| lastingly | In an enduring or permanent manner. |
| <u>memorable</u> | Worth remembering or easily remembered, especially because of being special or unusual. <i>He recalled memorable moments in his life.</i> |
| <u>permanent</u> | Lasting or continuing without interruption. <i>A permanent ban on the dumping of radioactive waste at sea.</i> |
| <u>stable</u> | Shelter in a stable. <i>Stable prices.</i> |
| standing | Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>An inter departmental squabble of long standing.</i> |
| unalienable | Incapable of being repudiated or transferred to another. <i>Endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights.</i> |
| <u>unchangeable</u> | Not changeable or subject to change-Ashley Montagu. <i>Personality characteristics are virtually unchangeable.</i> |
| <u>unchanging</u> | Conforming to the same principles or course of action over time. <i>The party stood for unchanging principles.</i> |
