## Associations of "For irreplaceable" (30 Words)

<b>abiding</b>	(of a feeling or memory) lasting a long time; enduring. <i>He had an <b>abiding</b> respect for her.</i>
<b><u>broken</u></b>	Having been broken. <i>A <b>broken</b> note.</i>
<b>changeless</b>	Not subject or susceptible to change or variation in form or quality or nature. <i><b>Changeless</b> truths.</i>
<b>conclusive</b>	(of a victory) achieved easily or by a large margin. <i><b>Conclusive</b> evidence.</i>
<b>confirmed</b>	Of persons; not subject to change. <i>Received <b>confirmed</b> reports of casualties.</i>
<b><u>consistent</u></b>	Sometimes followed by with in agreement or consistent or reliable. <i>Testimony <b>consistent</b> with the known facts.</i>
<b>constancy</b>	The quality of being faithful and dependable. <i>The <b>constancy</b> of the tradition.</i>
<b>constant</b>	A number representing a quantity assumed to have a fixed value in a specified mathematical context. <i>Maintained a <b>constant</b> temperature.</i>
<b><u>durable</u></b>	Capable of withstanding wear and tear and decay. <i>Less <b>durable</b> rocks were gradually worn away to form valleys.</i>
<b><u>enduring</u></b>	Patiently bearing continual wrongs or trouble. <i>He formed a number of <b>enduring</b> relationships with women.</i>
<b><u>fatal</u></b>	Leading to failure or disaster. <i>It is <b>fatal</b> to enter any war without the will to win it.</i>
<b>finality</b>	The quality of being final or definitely settled. <i>The abrupt <b>finality</b> of death.</i>

<b>fixed</b>	Having a fixed and unchanging value. <i>A <b>fixed</b> iron ladder down the port side.</i>
<b>immutable</b>	Constant and unchanging. <i>The <b>immutable</b> laws of nature.</i>
<b>indelible</b>	(of ink or a pen) making marks that cannot be removed. <i>The story made an <b>indelible</b> impression on me.</i>
<b>indestructible</b>	Very long lasting. <i><b>Indestructible</b> plastic containers.</i>
<b>ineradicable</b>	Unable to be destroyed or removed. <i><b>Ineradicable</b> hostility.</i>
<b>inseparable</b>	A person or thing inseparable from another. <i><b>Inseparable</b> pieces of rock.</i>
<b>invariable</b>	Not liable to or capable of change. <i>His <b>invariable</b> courtesy.</i>
<b>irremediable</b>	Impossible to cure or put right. <i><b>Irremediable</b> marital breakdowns.</i>
<b>irreparably</b>	In an irreparable manner or to an irreparable degree. <i>Our international image has been <b>irreparably</b> tarnished.</i>
<b><u>lasting</u></b>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>They left a <b>lasting</b> impression.</i>
<b>lastingly</b>	In an enduring or permanent manner.
<b><u>memorable</u></b>	Worth remembering or easily remembered, especially because of being special or unusual. <i>He recalled <b>memorable</b> moments in his life.</i>
<b><u>permanent</u></b>	Lasting or continuing without interruption. <i>A <b>permanent</b> ban on the dumping of radioactive waste at sea.</i>
<b><u>stable</u></b>	Shelter in a stable. <i><b>Stable</b> prices.</i>
<b>standing</b>	Executed in or initiated from a standing position. <i>An inter departmental squabble of long <b>standing</b>.</i>
<b>unalienable</b>	Incapable of being repudiated or transferred to another. <i>Endowed by their Creator with certain <b>unalienable</b> rights.</i>
<b><u>unchangeable</u></b>	Not changeable or subject to change-Ashley Montagu. <i>Personality characteristics are virtually <b>unchangeable</b>.</i>
<b><u>unchanging</u></b>	Conforming to the same principles or course of action over time. <i>The party stood for <b>unchanging</b> principles.</i>
