<b>abide</b>	Dwell. <i>At least one memory will <b>abide</b>.</i>
<b>bacteria</b>	Single-celled or noncellular spherical or spiral or rod-shaped organisms lacking chlorophyll that reproduce by fission; important as pathogens and for biochemical properties; taxonomy is difficult; often considered to be.
<b>be</b>	Be priced at. <i>I want to <b>be</b> a teacher.</i>
<b>being</b>	Being alive living. <i>A rational <b>being</b>.</i>
<b>citizen</b>	A native or naturalized member of a state or other political community. <i>The good <b>citizens</b> of Edinburgh.</i>
<b>creatively</b>	In an original or imaginative way. <i>This article inspires you to think <b>creatively</b>.</i>
<b>creature</b>	A human being; `wight' is an archaic term. <i>A <b>creature</b> from outer space.</i>
<b>dwell</b>	Live in or at a specified place. <i>Don t <b>dwell</b> on the past.</i>
<b>dweller</b>	A person or animal that lives in or at a specified place. <i>City <b>dwellers</b>.</i>
<b>existential</b>	Concerned with existentialism. <i>Formal logicians are not concerned with <b>existential</b> matters.</i>
<b>existing</b>	Existing in something specified. <i>Much of the beluga caviar <b>existing</b> in the world is found in the Soviet Union and Iran.</i>
<b>extant</b>	Still in existence; not extinct or destroyed or lost. <i>An <b>extant</b> letter.</i>

<b>fungi</b>	The taxonomic kingdom including yeast, molds, smuts, mushrooms, and toadstools; distinct from the green plants.
<b>germ</b>	An initial stage from which something may develop. <i>The <b>germ</b> of a brilliant idea.</i>
<b>habitant</b>	An inhabitant. <i>The <b>habitant</b> farmhouses of old Quebec.</i>
<b><u>habitat</u></b>	The natural home or environment of an animal, plant, or other organism. <i>Wild chimps in their natural <b>habitat</b>.</i>
<b><u>inhabit</u></b>	Inhabit or live in be an inhabitant of. <i>A bird that <b>inhabits</b> North America.</i>
<b>inhabitant</b>	A person or animal that lives in or occupies a place.
<b>intracellular</b>	Located or occurring within a cell or cells. <i><b>Intracellular</b> fluid.</i>
<b>life</b>	An account of the series of events making up a person's life. <i>He wanted to live his own <b>life</b> without interference from others.</i>
<b><u>lifelong</u></b>	Continuing through life. <i>The two men were to remain <b>lifelong</b> friends.</i>
<b>live</b>	Continue to live through hardship or adversity. <i>You must accept yourself and others if you really want to <b>live</b>.</i>
<b>multicellular</b>	(of an organism or part) having or consisting of many cells. <i><b>Multicellular</b> organisms.</i>
<b><u>organism</u></b>	The material structure of an organism. <i>The Church is a divinely constituted <b>organism</b>.</i>
<b>physiology</b>	The branch of the biological sciences dealing with the functioning of organisms. <i>The <b>physiology</b> of the brain.</i>
<b>populate</b>	Form the population of (a place). <i><b>Populate</b> the forest with deer and wild boar for hunting.</i>
<b>protoplasm</b>	The substance of a living cell (including cytoplasm and nucleus).
<b><u>reside</u></b>	Be inherent or innate in. <i>My parents <b>reside</b> in Florida.</i>
<b>resident</b>	Attached to and working regularly for a particular institution. <i>He has been <b>resident</b> in Brazil for a long time.</i>
<b>unicellular</b>	(of an evolutionary or developmental stage) characterized by the formation or presence of a single cell or cells. <i>Patches of <b>unicellular</b> algae.</i>
