## Associations of "For loyal" (30 Words)

<u>allegiance</u>	Loyalty or commitment to a superior or to a group or cause. A complex pattern of cross party <b>allegiance</b> s.
allegiant	Steadfast in devotion (especially to your lawful monarch or government. It is impossible to be <b>allegiant</b> to two opposing forces.
chauvinistic	Displaying excessive or prejudiced support for one's own cause or group, in particular showing male prejudice against women. <i>A chauvinistic</i> aggressive brand of nationalism.
<u>confidant</u>	A person with whom one shares a secret or private matter, trusting them not to repeat it to others. A close <b>confidant</b> e of the princess.
confiding	Willing to entrust personal matters. First she was suspicious then she became <b>confiding</b> .
<u>dedication</u>	An inscription or form of words dedicating a building, book, etc. to a person or deity. The hardback edition contained a fulsome <b>dedication</b> to his wife.
<u>devoted</u>	(followed by `to') dedicated exclusively to a purpose or use. There is a museum <b>devoted</b> to her work.
dutiful	Willingly obedient out of a sense of duty and respect. A <b>dutiful</b> daughter.
epigone	An inferior imitator of some distinguished writer or artist of musician. The humdrum compositions of some of Beethoven s <b>epigone</b> s.
<u>faith</u>	Complete confidence in a person or plan etc. <i>He lost his <b>faith</b> but not his morality.</i>
<u>faithful</u>	Those who are faithful to a particular religion or political party. We do not doubt that England has a <b>faithful</b> patriot in the Lord Chancellor.
faithfully	In a manner that is true to the facts or the original. <i>He swore that he would serve the king <b>faithfully</b>.</i>



follower	A person who supports and admires a particular person or set of ideas. <i>Followers of Nietzsche.</i>
<u>housekeeper</u>	A servant who is employed to perform domestic task in a household.
jingoism	An appeal intended to arouse patriotic emotions. The popular <b>jingoism</b> that swept the lower middle classes.
liege	A person holding a fief; a person who owes allegiance and service to a feudal lord. <i>The Scots obeyed him as their liege</i> lord.
loyalty	A strong feeling of support or allegiance. <i>His extreme <b>loyalty</b> to the Crown.</i>
<u>minion</u>	A servile or fawning dependant. <i>He gets oppressed <b>minion</b>s like me to fob them off.</i>
<u>obedient</u>	Dutifully complying with the commands or instructions of those in authority. <i>The <b>obedient</b> colonies are heavily taxed the refractory remain unburdened.</i>
patriotic	Having or expressing devotion to and vigorous support for one's country. Today s game will be played before a fiercely <b>patriotic</b> crowd.
<u>servant</u>	A person working in the service of another (especially in the household. <i>A government servant</i> .
subservience	Abject or cringing submissiveness. <i>He demonstrated his complete</i> <b>subservience</b> to his masters.
toady	A pufferfish. She imagined him <b>toady</b> ing to his rich clients.
trust	A trustful relationship. <i>He can be <b>trust</b>ed to carry out an impartial investigation.</i>
<u>trusted</u>	Worthy of trust or confidence. A <b>trusted</b> adviser.
trustful	Having or marked by a total belief in the reliability, truth, or ability of someone. Great brown eye true and <b>trustful</b> .
trusting	Inclined to believe or confide readily; full of trust. It is foolish to be too <b>trusting</b> of other people.
<u>trustworthy</u>	Taking responsibility for one's conduct and obligations. <i>Trustworthy public servants.</i>
underling	An assistant subject to the authority or control of another. She was shouting orders at <b>underling</b> s between gulps of coffee.
