<u>allegiance</u>	Loyalty or commitment to a superior or to a group or cause. A complex pattern of cross party allegiance s.
allegiant	Steadfast in devotion (especially to your lawful monarch or government. It is impossible to be allegiant to two opposing forces.
chauvinistic	Displaying excessive or prejudiced support for one's own cause or group, in particular showing male prejudice against women. <i>A chauvinistic</i> aggressive brand of nationalism.
<u>confidant</u>	A person with whom one shares a secret or private matter, trusting them not to repeat it to others. A close confidant e of the princess.
confiding	Willing to entrust personal matters. First she was suspicious then she became confiding .
<u>dedication</u>	An inscription or form of words dedicating a building, book, etc. to a person or deity. The hardback edition contained a fulsome dedication to his wife.
<u>devoted</u>	(followed by `to') dedicated exclusively to a purpose or use. There is a museum devoted to her work.
dutiful	Willingly obedient out of a sense of duty and respect. A dutiful daughter.
epigone	An inferior imitator of some distinguished writer or artist of musician. The humdrum compositions of some of Beethoven s epigone s.
<u>faith</u>	Complete confidence in a person or plan etc. <i>He lost his faith but not his morality.</i>
<u>faithful</u>	Those who are faithful to a particular religion or political party. We do not doubt that England has a faithful patriot in the Lord Chancellor.
faithfully	In a manner that is true to the facts or the original. <i>He swore that he would serve the king faithfully.</i>



follower	A person who supports and admires a particular person or set of ideas. <i>Followers of Nietzsche.</i>
<u>housekeeper</u>	A servant who is employed to perform domestic task in a household.
jingoism	An appeal intended to arouse patriotic emotions. The popular jingoism that swept the lower middle classes.
liege	A person holding a fief; a person who owes allegiance and service to a feudal lord. <i>The Scots obeyed him as their liege</i> lord.
loyalty	A strong feeling of support or allegiance. <i>His extreme loyalty to the Crown.</i>
<u>minion</u>	A servile or fawning dependant. <i>He gets oppressed minions like me to fob them off.</i>
<u>obedient</u>	Dutifully complying with the commands or instructions of those in authority. <i>The obedient colonies are heavily taxed the refractory remain unburdened.</i>
patriotic	Having or expressing devotion to and vigorous support for one's country. Today s game will be played before a fiercely patriotic crowd.
<u>servant</u>	A person working in the service of another (especially in the household. <i>A government servant</i> .
subservience	Abject or cringing submissiveness. <i>He demonstrated his complete</i> subservience to his masters.
toady	A pufferfish. She imagined him toady ing to his rich clients.
trust	A trustful relationship. <i>He can be trusted to carry out an impartial investigation.</i>
<u>trusted</u>	Worthy of trust or confidence. A trusted adviser.
trustful	Having or marked by a total belief in the reliability, truth, or ability of someone. Great brown eye true and trustful .
trusting	Inclined to believe or confide readily; full of trust. It is foolish to be too trusting of other people.
<u>trustworthy</u>	Taking responsibility for one's conduct and obligations. <i>Trustworthy public servants.</i>
underling	An assistant subject to the authority or control of another. She was shouting orders at underling s between gulps of coffee.
