amusement	The provision or enjoyment of entertainment. <i>On the promenade the amusements were still open.</i>
banter	Light teasing repartee. <i>The men bantered with the waitresses.</i>
buffoonery	Behaviour that is ridiculous but amusing. <i>The film is full of wordplay and buffoonery.</i>
cheerfulness	The quality or state of being noticeably happy and optimistic. <i>The cheerfulness from the fire.</i>
comedy	The style or genre represented by comedy films plays and broadcast programmes. <i>A comedy film.</i>
entertaining	Providing amusement or enjoyment. <i>Films should be entertaining.</i>
exhilaration	A feeling of excitement, happiness, or elation. <i>They felt the exhilaration of victory.</i>
funny	A joke or witty remark. <i>I had a funny feeling you d be around.</i>
gaiety	Entertainments or amusements. <i>The sudden gaiety of children s laughter.</i>
hilarious	Extremely amusing. <i>Her hilarious novel.</i>
hilarity	Boisterous merriment. <i>His incredulous expression was the cause of much hilarity.</i>
humor	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>You can t survive in the army without a sense of humor.</i>
humorous	Full of or characterized by humor. <i>In a humorous vein.</i>

humour	The ability to express humour or amuse other people. <i>Their inimitable brand of humour.</i>
jest	A humorous anecdote or remark intended to provoke laughter. <i>You jest surely.</i>
jocose	Playful or humorous. <i>A jocose allusion.</i>
jocular	Characterized by jokes and good humor. <i>She sounded in a jocular mood.</i>
joke	Tell a joke speak humorously. <i>She could laugh and joke with her colleagues.</i>
jollity	Feeling jolly and jovial and full of good humor. <i>A night of riotous jollity.</i>
jolly	Very; extremely. <i>The jolly crowd at the reunion.</i>
jovial	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment- Wordsworth. <i>A jovial old gentleman.</i>
joviality	A jovial nature.
laugh	The sound of laughing. <i>She gave a loud silly laugh.</i>
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing children.</i>
merriment	Gaiety and fun. <i>Her eyes sparkled with merriment.</i>
merry	Quick and energetic. <i>Peals of merry laughter.</i>
repartee	Conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. <i>He had a quick mind and a splendid gift of repartee.</i>
slapstick	Acoustic device consisting of two paddles hinged together; used by an actor to make a loud noise without inflicting injury when striking someone. <i>A loud and exhilarating rattle of bladders and slapsticks.</i>
wit	A witty person. <i>His caustic wit cuts through the humbug.</i>
witticism	A witty remark. <i>Maurice roared with laughter at his own witticisms.</i>
