<a href="#">amusement</a>	The provision or enjoyment of entertainment. <i>On the promenade the <b>amusements</b> were still open.</i>
<a href="#">banter</a>	Light teasing repartee. <i>The men <b>bantered</b> with the waitresses.</i>
<b>buffoonery</b>	Behaviour that is ridiculous but amusing. <i>The film is full of wordplay and <b>buffoonery</b>.</i>
<b>cheerfulness</b>	The quality or state of being noticeably happy and optimistic. <i>The <b>cheerfulness</b> from the fire.</i>
<a href="#">comedy</a>	The style or genre represented by comedy films plays and broadcast programmes. <i>A <b>comedy</b> film.</i>
<a href="#">entertaining</a>	Providing amusement or enjoyment. <i>Films should be <b>entertaining</b>.</i>
<a href="#">exhilaration</a>	A feeling of excitement, happiness, or elation. <i>They felt the <b>exhilaration</b> of victory.</i>
<b>funny</b>	A joke or witty remark. <i>I had a <b>funny</b> feeling you d be around.</i>
<b>gaiety</b>	Entertainments or amusements. <i>The sudden <b>gaiety</b> of children s laughter.</i>
<a href="#">hilarious</a>	Extremely amusing. <i>Her <b>hilarious</b> novel.</i>
<b>hilarity</b>	Boisterous merriment. <i>His incredulous expression was the cause of much <b>hilarity</b>.</i>
<b>humor</b>	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. <i>You can t survive in the army without a sense of <b>humor</b>.</i>
<b>humorous</b>	Full of or characterized by humor. <i>In a <b>humorous</b> vein.</i>

<b>humour</b>	The ability to express humour or amuse other people. <i>Their inimitable brand of <b>humour</b>.</i>
<b>jest</b>	A humorous anecdote or remark intended to provoke laughter. <i>You <b>jest</b> surely.</i>
<b>jocose</b>	Playful or humorous. <i>A <b>jocose</b> allusion.</i>
<b>jocular</b>	Characterized by jokes and good humor. <i>She sounded in a <b>jocular</b> mood.</i>
<a href="#"><u>joke</u></a>	Tell a joke speak humorously. <i>She could laugh and <b>joke</b> with her colleagues.</i>
<b>jollity</b>	Feeling jolly and jovial and full of good humor. <i>A night of riotous <b>jollity</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>jolly</u></a>	Very; extremely. <i>The <b>jolly</b> crowd at the reunion.</i>
<a href="#"><u>jovial</u></a>	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment- Wordsworth. <i>A <b>jovial</b> old gentleman.</i>
<b>joviality</b>	A jovial nature.
<b>laugh</b>	The sound of laughing. <i>She gave a loud silly <b>laugh</b>.</i>
<b>laughing</b>	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i><b>Laughing</b> children.</i>
<b>merriment</b>	Gaiety and fun. <i>Her eyes sparkled with <b>merriment</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>merry</u></a>	Quick and energetic. <i>Peals of <b>merry</b> laughter.</i>
<b>repartee</b>	Conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. <i>He had a quick mind and a splendid gift of <b>repartee</b>.</i>
<b>slapstick</b>	Acoustic device consisting of two paddles hinged together; used by an actor to make a loud noise without inflicting injury when striking someone. <i>A loud and exhilarating rattle of bladders and <b>slapsticks</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>wit</u></a>	A witty person. <i>His caustic <b>wit</b> cuts through the humbug.</i>
<b>witticism</b>	A witty remark. <i>Maurice roared with laughter at his own <b>witticisms</b>.</i>
