gaiety	Entertainments or amusements. The sudden gaiety of children s laughter.
<u>hilarious</u>	Extremely amusing. <i>Her hilarious novel.</i>
hilarity	Boisterous merriment. <i>His incredulous expression was the cause of much hilarity.</i>
humor	The trait of appreciating and being able to express the humorous. You can t survive in the army without a sense of humor .
humorous	Full of or characterized by humor. In a humorous vein.



humour	The ability to express humour or amuse other people. <i>Their inimitable brand of humour</i> .
jest	A humorous anecdote or remark intended to provoke laughter. <i>You jest surely.</i>
jocose	Playful or humorous. A jocose allusion.
jocular	Characterized by jokes and good humor. She sounded in a jocular mood.
<u>joke</u>	Tell a joke speak humorously. She could laugh and joke with her colleagues.
jollity	Feeling jolly and jovial and full of good humor. A night of riotous jollity .
<u>jolly</u>	Very; extremely. The jolly crowd at the reunion.
<u>jovial</u>	Full of or showing high-spirited merriment- Wordsworth. A jovial old gentleman.
joviality	A jovial nature.
laugh	The sound of laughing. She gave a loud silly laugh .
laughing	Showing or feeling mirth or pleasure or happiness. <i>Laughing</i> children.
merriment	Gaiety and fun. Her eyes sparkled with merriment .
merry	Quick and energetic. Peals of merry laughter.
repartee	Conversation or speech characterized by quick, witty comments or replies. <i>He had a quick mind and a splendid gift of repartee.</i>
slapstick	Acoustic device consisting of two paddles hinged together; used by an actor to make a loud noise without inflicting injury when striking someone. <i>A loud and exhilarating rattle of bladders and slapsticks</i> .
<u>wit</u>	A witty person. His caustic wit cuts through the humbug.
witticism	A witty remark. Maurice roared with laughter at his own witticism s.
