## Associations of "For makes sense" (30 Words)

<b>build</b>	Build or establish something abstract. <i><b>Build</b> a reputation.</i>
<b>compel</b>	Force or oblige (someone) to do something. <i>The water shortage <b>compels</b> conservation.</i>
<b><u>compulsion</u></b>	The action or state of forcing or being forced to do something; constraint. <i>The payment was made under <b>compulsion</b>.</i>
<b><u>concoct</u></b>	Make a concoction of by mixing. <i>His cronies <b>concocted</b> a simple plan.</i>
<b>constrain</b>	To close within bounds, or otherwise limit or deprive of free movement. <i>Calypso in her caves <b>constrained</b> his stay.</i>
<b>construct</b>	A physical thing which is deliberately built or formed. <i>Poetics should <b>construct</b> a theory of literary discourse.</i>
<b>create</b>	Create by artistic means. <i>He <b>created</b> a thirty acre lake.</i>
<b>creativity</b>	The ability to create.
<b>creativity</b>	The use of imagination or original ideas to create something; inventiveness. <i>Firms are keen to encourage <b>creativity</b>.</i>
<b><u>devise</u></b>	Arrange by systematic planning and united effort. <i><b>Devise</b> a plan to take over the director s office.</i>
<b>fabricate</b>	Make up something artificial or untrue. <i>You will have to <b>fabricate</b> an exhaust system.</i>
<b><u>factory</u></b>	An establishment for traders carrying on business in a foreign country. <i>The group have become a rock and roll hit <b>factory</b>.</i>
<b>figment</b>	A thing that someone believes to be real but that exists only in their imagination. <i>It really was Ross and not a <b>figment</b> of her overheated imagination.</i>

<b>forge</b>	Make something, usually for a specific function. <i>He <b>forged</b> a great suit of black armour.</i>
<b>idea</b>	An opinion or belief. <i>The <b>idea</b> of the game is to capture all the pieces.</i>
<b>imagination</b>	The ability to deal resourcefully with unusual problems. <i>She was set in her ways and lacked <b>imagination</b>.</i>
<b>impromptu</b>	With little or no preparation or forethought. <i>An <b>impromptu</b> speech.</i>
<b>improvised</b>	Done or made using whatever is available; makeshift. <i>We slept on <b>improvised</b> beds.</i>
<b>instinctive</b>	(of a person) doing or being a specified thing apparently naturally or automatically. <i>An <b>instinctive</b> distaste for conflict.</i>
<b>invent</b>	Make up something artificial or untrue. <i>He <b>invented</b> an improved form of the steam engine.</i>
<b>invention</b>	Something fabricated or made up. <i>The <b>invention</b> of printing in the 15th century.</i>
<b>inventive</b>	(used of persons or artifacts) marked by independence and creativity in thought or action. <i><b>Inventive</b> ceramics.</i>
<b>inventor</b>	Someone who is the first to think of or make something.
<b>makeshift</b>	Done or made using whatever is available. <i>The rock served as a <b>makeshift</b> hammer.</i>
<b>manufacture</b>	Manufactured articles. <i>Claims that the entire row had been <b>manufactured</b> by the press.</i>
<b>originality</b>	The quality of being novel or unusual. <i>She is a writer of great <b>originality</b>.</i>
<b>produce</b>	Bring out for display. <i>The garden where the artist <b>produced</b> many of his flower paintings.</i>
<b>productive</b>	Achieving a significant amount or result. <i>The hotel was not <b>productive</b> of amusing company.</i>
<b>ruse</b>	An action intended to deceive someone; a trick. <i>Emma tried to think of a <b>ruse</b> to get Paul out of the house.</i>
<b>spontaneous</b>	(of a plant) growing naturally and without being tended or cultivated. <i><b>Spontaneous</b> laughter.</i>
