judiciary	The judicial authorities of a country; judges collectively. <i>The independence of the <b>judiciary</b>.</i>	
juridical	Of or relating to the law or jurisprudence. <i>Clear words are a matter of practical rather than</i> <b>juridical</b> significance.	
<u>lawful</u>	Of a child born within a lawful marriage. <i>Lawful</i> methods of dissent.	
legal	Having legal efficacy or force. The European <b>legal</b> system.	
legality	The quality or state of being in accordance with the law. Documentation testifying to the <b>legality</b> of the arms sale.	
legislator	A person who makes laws; a member of a legislative body. 24 incumbent <b>legislator</b> s lost their seats.	
legislature	The legislative body of a country or state. <i>The Nevada state</i> <b>legislature</b> <i>passed a law to prohibit dumping of nuclear waste.</i>	
legitimate	Make an illegitimate child legitimate declare the legitimacy of someone. A <b>legitimate</b> male heir.	
legitimately	In a lawfully recognized manner. Consumers could <b>legitimately</b> claim to have been misled.	
licit	Authorized, sanctioned by, or in accordance with law. Usage patterns differ between <b>licit</b> and il <b>licit</b> drugs.	
parliament	The members of Parliament between one dissolution and the next. <i>The Russian <b>parliament</b></i> .	
policy	Written contract or certificate of insurance. You should have read the small print on your <b>policy</b> .	
polity	The form of government of a social organization. A vision of a plural Arab <b>polity</b> .	
right	A blow given with the right fist. <i>The <b>right</b> time to act.</i>	



senator	A Lord of Session. <b>Senator</b> Vandenburg.
statutory	Relating to or created by statutes. <i>A statutory age limit.</i>
