<b>acupuncture</b>	A system of complementary medicine in which fine needles are inserted in the skin at specific points along what are considered to be lines of energy (meridians), used in the treatment of various physical and mental conditions.
<b>biofeedback</b>	A process whereby electronic monitoring of a normally automatic bodily function is used to train someone to acquire voluntary control of that function.
<b>chiroprapist</b>	A person who treats the feet and their ailments. <i>She decided to train as a <b>chiroprapist</b>.</i>
<b>counselor</b>	Someone who gives advice about problems.
<b>curative</b>	A curative medicine or agent. <i><b>Curative</b> powers of herbal remedies.</i>
<a href="#">cure</a>	A substance or treatment that cures a disease or condition. <i>A bid to trace and <b>cure</b> the gearbox problems.</i>
<b>dialysis</b>	The clinical purification of blood by dialysis as a substitute for the normal function of the kidney.
<b>doctor</b>	Restore by replacing a part or putting together what is torn or broken. <i>She is a <b>doctor</b> of philosophy in physics.</i>
<b>dosage</b>	A measured portion of medicine taken at any one time. <i>There are recommendations about <b>dosage</b> in elderly patients.</i>
<a href="#">healer</a>	Something that alleviates distress or anguish. <i>A spiritual <b>healer</b> and medium.</i>
<b>healing</b>	The natural process by which the body repairs itself. <i>The <b>healing</b> process.</i>
<b>herbal</b>	A book that describes herbs and their culinary and medicinal properties. <i><b>Herbal</b> remedies.</i>

<b>homeopathy</b>	A method of treating disease with small amounts of remedies that, in large amounts in healthy people, produce symptoms similar to those being treated.
<b>injection</b>	A thing that is injected. <i>A morphine <b>injection</b>.</i>
<b>medicine</b>	Treat medicinally treat with medicine. <i>The remarkable achievements of modern <b>medicine</b>.</i>
<b>nostrum</b>	Hypothetical remedy for all ills or diseases; once sought by the alchemists. <i>A charlatan who sells <b>nostrums</b>.</i>
<b>orthopedic</b>	Of or relating to orthopedics. <i><b>Orthopedic</b> shoes.</i>
<b>osteopath</b>	A therapist who manipulates the skeleton and muscles.
<b>pharmacopoeia</b>	An official publication containing a list of medicinal drugs with their effects and directions for their use.
<b>podiatrist</b>	A person who treats the feet and their ailments; a chiropodist. <i>If a toe has a discharge it is likely infected and needs to be treated by a <b>podiatrist</b>.</i>
<b>psychiatrist</b>	A medical practitioner specializing in the diagnosis and treatment of mental illness.
<b>relaxing</b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The warm water was very <b>relaxing</b>.</i>
<b>remedial</b>	Tending or intended to rectify or improve. <i><b>Remedial</b> education.</i>
<b>remedy</b>	The margin within which coins as minted may differ from the standard fineness and weight. <i>Compensation is available as a <b>remedy</b> against governmental institutions.</i>
<b>rub</b>	Scrape or rub as if to relieve itching. <i>She <b>rubbed</b> her arm where she had a large bruise.</i>
<b>therapeutic</b>	Administered or applied for reasons of health. <i>A <b>therapeutic</b> silence.</i>
<b>therapist</b>	A person who treats psychological problems a psychotherapist. <i>Cost is one factor keeping them from the <b>therapist</b> s couch.</i>
<b>therapy</b>	The act of caring for someone (as by medication or remedial training etc). <i>The <b>therapy</b> helps the patient to deal with difficult relationships.</i>
