Associations of "For multifaceted" (30 Words)

<u>assorted</u>	Of various sorts put together; miscellaneous. <i>An arrangement of assorted spring flowers.</i>
assortment	The act of distributing things into classes or categories of the same type. <i>A great assortment of cars was on display.</i>
classification	The basic cognitive process of arranging into classes or categories. <i>The classification of the platypus was one of the critical issues of the 1830s.</i>
<u>dissimilar</u>	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>Their understanding of the world is not so dissimilar from our own.</i>
diverse	Including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds and of different genders, sexual orientations, etc. <i>A person of diverse talents.</i>
diversity	Noticeable heterogeneity. <i>There was considerable diversity in the style of the reports.</i>
eclectic	Someone who selects according to the eclectic method. <i>Her musical tastes are eclectic.</i>
heterogeneous	Originating outside the body. <i>Heterogeneous catalysis.</i>
hexagon	A six-sided polygon.
itemize	Specify (an individual item or items). <i>I have itemized the morning s tasks.</i>
manifold	A set of points such as those of a closed surface or an analogue in three or more dimensions. <i>The appeal of the crusade was manifold.</i>
miscellaneous	(of items or people gathered or considered together) of various types or from different sources. <i>Miscellaneous accessories.</i>

miscellany	A group or collection of different items; a mixture. <i>A miscellany of houses.</i>
mixed	Consisting of different qualities or elements. <i>The college s mixed hockey team.</i>
motley	A garment made of motley especially a court jester s costume. <i>A motley crew.</i>
multifarious	Having many aspects or qualities. <i>The multifarious noise of a great city.</i>
multiplicity	A large number or variety. <i>The demand for higher education depends on a multiplicity of factors.</i>
numerous	Great in number; many. <i>Numerous times.</i>
octagon	An object or building with an octagonal plan or cross section.
pastiche	Imitate the style of (an artist or work). <i>The songs amount to much more than blatant pastiche.</i>
pluralism	A condition or system in which two or more states, groups, principles, sources of authority, etc., coexist.
polygon	A closed plane figure bounded by straight sides.
potpourri	A mixture or medley of things. <i>He played a potpourri of tunes from Gilbert and Sullivan.</i>
protean	Tending or able to change frequently or easily. <i>It is difficult to comprehend the whole of this protean subject.</i>
sundry	Of various kinds; several. <i>Sundry sciences commonly known as social.</i>
type	Write something on a typewriter or computer by pressing the keys. <i>The word element contains five different types of character.</i>
<u>varied</u>	Broken away from sameness or identity or duplication. <i>His work is interesting and varied.</i>
variety	A collection containing a variety of sorts of things. <i>A variety show.</i>
<u>various</u>	Distinctly dissimilar or unlike. <i>Animals as various as the jaguar and the cavy and the sloth.</i>
<u>vary</u>	Change from one condition, form, or state to another. <i>The properties vary in price.</i>
