afternoon	In the afternoon every afternoon. <i>She worked on Tuesday afternoons.</i>
bedtime	The time you go to bed. <i>It was well past her bedtime.</i>
darken	(of someone’s eyes or expression) show anger, sorrow, or another strong negative emotion. <i>Guy s expression darkened.</i>
dawn	(of a day) begin. <i>It was the dawn of the Roman Empire.</i>
day	A day assigned to a particular purpose or observance. <i>How long is a day on Jupiter.</i>
daybreak	The first light of day. <i>She set off at daybreak.</i>
evening	In the evening every evening. <i>It was the evening of the Roman Empire.</i>
friday	The sixth day of the week; the fifth working day.
gloaming	Twilight; dusk. <i>Hundreds of lights are already shimmering in the gloaming.</i>
hour	A time specified on the twenty four hour clock. <i>You can t turn him away at this hour.</i>
meditate	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>I set aside time every day to write and meditate.</i>
meditative	Deeply or seriously thoughtful. <i>Meditative techniques.</i>
midnight	Twelve o’clock at night. <i>The midnight hours.</i>

morning	Every morning. <i>Mornings she d sleep late.</i>
nightfall	The onset of night; dusk. <i>We had to get back by nightfall.</i>
nocturnal	Of or relating to or occurring in the night. <i>Nocturnal plants have flowers that open at night and close by day.</i>
nocturnally	At night.
noon	The middle of the day. <i>The service starts at twelve noon.</i>
o'clock	According to the clock.
sunday	First day of the week; observed as a day of rest and worship by most Christians.
sunrise	The time in the morning when the sun appears or full daylight arrives. <i>A spectacular sunrise over the summit of the mountain.</i>
sunset	Atmospheric phenomena accompanying the daily disappearance of the sun. <i>The sunset of his life.</i>
thursday	The fifth day of the week; the fourth working day.
tomorrow	In the future, especially the near future. <i>Fickle buyers who may be gone tomorrow.</i>
tonight	The present or immediately coming night. <i>Drop by tonight.</i>
tuesday	The third day of the week; the second working day.
twilight	The period of the evening when twilight is visible between daylight and darkness. <i>A twilight world of secrecy.</i>
wake	Be awake be alert be there. <i>Please wake me at 6 AM.</i>
wednesday	The fourth day of the week; the third working day.
yesterday	In the recent past; only a short time ago. <i>My wife had a baby boy yesterday morning.</i>
