## Associations of "For nightmare" (30 Words)

<b><a href="#">alarm</a></b>	Be fitted or protected with an alarm. <i>This door is locked and <b>alarmed</b> between 11 p m and 6 a m.</i>
<b><a href="#">alarming</a></b>	Frightening because of an awareness of danger. <i>Our countryside is disappearing at an <b>alarming</b> rate.</i>
<b><a href="#">awake</a></b>	Mentally perceptive and responsive. <i>Lay <b>awake</b> thinking about his new job.</i>
<b>awaken</b>	Rouse from sleep; cause to stop sleeping. <i>The film helped to <b>awaken</b> many to the horrors of apartheid.</i>
<b>bed</b>	Place plants in a prepared bed of soil. <i>The salad is served on a <b>bed</b> of raw spinach.</i>
<b><a href="#">bedtime</a></b>	The time you go to bed. <i>It was well past her <b>bedtime</b>.</i>
<b>conscious</b>	(of an action or feeling) deliberate and intentional. <i>When you go to sleep it is only the <b>conscious</b> mind which shuts down.</i>
<b>day</b>	Daylight. <i>She cared for him for the rest of his <b>days</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">dream</a></b>	Have a daydream indulge in a fantasy. <i>This is not at all how she <b>dreamed</b> her baby s birthday was going to be.</i>
<b><a href="#">dreaming</a></b>	A series of mental images and emotions occurring during sleep.
<b>hesitantly</b>	In a tentative or unsure manner. <i>A young guard <b>hesitantly</b> stepped into the room.</i>
<b>incubus</b>	A situation resembling a terrifying dream. <i>Debt is a big <b>incubus</b> in developing countries.</i>
<b>insomnia</b>	An inability to sleep; chronic sleeplessness.
<b><a href="#">morning</a></b>	Every morning. <i>I ve got a meeting this <b>morning</b>.</i>

<b>nap</b>	Take a siesta. <i>She <b>naps</b> everyday after lunch for an hour.</i>
<b>oversleep</b>	Sleep longer or later than one intended. <i>We talked until the early hours and consequently I overslept.</i>
<b>restlessly</b>	In a restless manner.
<b>rouse</b>	Cause to be agitated excited or roused. <i>She <b>roused</b> and looked around.</i>
<b>scared</b>	Fearful; frightened. <i>I was <b>scared</b> that people were going to take pictures of me.</i>
<b>sleep</b>	A state compared to or resembling sleep such as death or complete silence or stillness. <i>Copenhagen likes to be known as the city that never <b>sleeps</b>.</i>
<b>sleepless</b>	Experiencing or accompanied by sleeplessness. <i>Another <b>sleepless</b> night.</i>
<b>slumber</b>	A natural and periodic state of rest during which consciousness of the world is suspended. <i>Sleeping Beauty <b>slumbered</b> in her forest castle.</i>
<b>tonight</b>	The evening or night of the present day. <i>Drop by <b>tonight</b>.</i>
<b>uneasily</b>	In a way that shows anxiety or discomfort. <i>Quite luxurious enclaves coexist <b>uneasily</b> with slums and ghettos.</i>
<b>uneasy</b>	(of a situation or relationship) not settled; liable to change. <i><b>Uneasy</b> lies the head that wears the crown.</i>
<b>wakeful</b>	Carefully observant or attentive; on the lookout for possible danger. <i><b>Wakeful</b> nights.</i>
<b>waken</b>	Stop sleeping. <i>They combined to <b>waken</b> a forgotten and futile hope.</i>
<b>waking</b>	The state of being awake. <i>Worked every moment of my <b>waking</b> hours.</i>
<b>worry</b>	Feel or cause to feel anxious or troubled about actual or potential problems. <i>There was no need to <b>worry</b> her.</i>
<b>worst</b>	The least favorable outcome. <i>At least 32 people died in Australia s <b>worst</b> bus accident.</i>
