<b>ascendant</b>	Tending or directed upward. <i>The newly <b>ascendant</b> liberal party.</i>
<b>controllable</b>	Capable of being directed or influenced. <i>The glider was fully <b>controllable</b>.</i>
<b>dominate</b>	Be larger in number, quantity, power, status or importance. <i>Her husband completely <b>dominates</b> her.</i>
<b>dominated</b>	Harassed by persistent nagging.
<b>govern</b>	Conduct oneself, especially with regard to controlling one's emotions. <i>Most transitive verbs <b>govern</b> the accusative case in German.</i>
<a href="#"><b>governing</b></a>	The act of governing exercising authority. <i>Regulations for the <b>governing</b> of state prisons.</i>
<a href="#"><b>indiscriminately</b></a>	In a random manner. <i>His armies slaughtered men women and children <b>indiscriminately</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>manageable</b></a>	Capable of existing or taking place or proving true; possible to do. <i>Her long hair was black wavy and <b>manageable</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><b>mastery</b></a>	The act of mastering or subordinating someone. <i>She played with some <b>mastery</b>.</i>
<b>monocracy</b>	A system of government by one person only.
<a href="#"><b>monopolize</b></a>	Get or keep exclusively to oneself. <i>Sophie <b>monopolized</b> the guest of honour for most of the evening.</i>
<a href="#"><b>obedience</b></a>	The act of obeying; dutiful or submissive behavior with respect to another person. <i><b>Obedience</b> to moral standards.</i>
<a href="#"><b>obedient</b></a>	Dutifully complying with the commands or instructions of those in authority. <i>The <b>obedient</b> colonies are heavily taxed the refractory remain unburdened.</i>

<b><u>obsession</u></b>	An unhealthy and compulsive preoccupation with something or someone. <i>She cared for him with a devotion bordering on <b>obsession</b>.</i>
<b><u>overlord</u></b>	A ruler, especially a feudal lord. <i>Charles was <b>overlord</b> of vast territories in Europe.</i>
<b>potentate</b>	A ruler who is unconstrained by law.
<b>reign</b>	Have sovereign power. <i>In America baseball <b>reigns</b> supreme.</i>
<b>rudder</b>	Application of a rudder in steering a boat ship or aircraft. <i>A small amount of extra <b>rudder</b>.</i>
<b>sovereignty</b>	Supreme power or authority. <i>The <b>sovereignty</b> of Parliament.</i>
<b><u>steer</u></b>	The type of steering of a vehicle. <i>He made an attempt to <b>steer</b> the conversation back to Heather.</i>
<b><u>subjugate</u></b>	Make subservient; force to submit or subdue. <i>The rich landowners <b>subjugated</b> the peasants working the land.</i>
<b><u>subjugation</u></b>	Forced submission to control by others. <i>The colonial <b>subjugation</b> of a country by means of brute military force.</i>
<b>superintendence</b>	The management or arrangement of an activity or organization; supervision. <i>The school was under the <b>superintendence</b> of the nuns of the convent.</i>
<b>supervision</b>	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. <i>He was placed under the <b>supervision</b> of a probation officer.</i>
<b><u>supremacy</u></b>	Power to dominate or defeat. <i>The <b>supremacy</b> of the king.</i>
<b>tame</b>	(of land) cultivated. <i>Network TV on Saturday night is a pretty <b>tame</b> affair.</i>
<b>thermostat</b>	Control the temperature with a thermostat.
<b><u>tractable</u></b>	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded)- Samuel Butler. <i>A <b>tractable</b> student.</i>
<b>tyrannize</b>	Rule or exercise power over (somebody) in a cruel and autocratic manner. <i>He <b>tyrannizes</b> over the servants.</i>
