ascendant	Tending or directed upward. <i>The newly ascendant liberal party.</i>
controllable	Capable of being directed or influenced. <i>The glider was fully controllable.</i>
dominate	Be larger in number, quantity, power, status or importance. <i>Her husband completely dominates her.</i>
dominated	Harassed by persistent nagging.
govern	Conduct oneself, especially with regard to controlling one's emotions. <i>Most transitive verbs govern the accusative case in German.</i>
governing	The act of governing exercising authority. <i>Regulations for the governing of state prisons.</i>
indiscriminately	In a random manner. <i>His armies slaughtered men women and children indiscriminately.</i>
manageable	Capable of existing or taking place or proving true; possible to do. <i>Her long hair was black wavy and manageable.</i>
mastery	The act of mastering or subordinating someone. <i>She played with some mastery.</i>
monocracy	A system of government by one person only.
monopolize	Get or keep exclusively to oneself. <i>Sophie monopolized the guest of honour for most of the evening.</i>
obedience	The act of obeying; dutiful or submissive behavior with respect to another person. <i>Obedience to moral standards.</i>
obedient	Dutifully complying with the commands or instructions of those in authority. <i>The obedient colonies are heavily taxed the refractory remain unburdened.</i>

<u>obsession</u>	An unhealthy and compulsive preoccupation with something or someone. <i>She cared for him with a devotion bordering on obsession.</i>
<u>overlord</u>	A ruler, especially a feudal lord. <i>Charles was overlord of vast territories in Europe.</i>
potentate	A ruler who is unconstrained by law.
reign	Have sovereign power. <i>In America baseball reigns supreme.</i>
rudder	Application of a rudder in steering a boat ship or aircraft. <i>A small amount of extra rudder.</i>
sovereignty	Supreme power or authority. <i>The sovereignty of Parliament.</i>
<u>steer</u>	The type of steering of a vehicle. <i>He made an attempt to steer the conversation back to Heather.</i>
<u>subjugate</u>	Make subservient; force to submit or subdue. <i>The rich landowners subjugated the peasants working the land.</i>
<u>subjugation</u>	Forced submission to control by others. <i>The colonial subjugation of a country by means of brute military force.</i>
superintendence	The management or arrangement of an activity or organization; supervision. <i>The school was under the superintendence of the nuns of the convent.</i>
supervision	Management by overseeing the performance or operation of a person or group. <i>He was placed under the supervision of a probation officer.</i>
<u>supremacy</u>	Power to dominate or defeat. <i>The supremacy of the king.</i>
tame	(of land) cultivated. <i>Network TV on Saturday night is a pretty tame affair.</i>
thermostat	Control the temperature with a thermostat.
<u>tractable</u>	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded)- Samuel Butler. <i>A tractable student.</i>
tyrannize	Rule or exercise power over (somebody) in a cruel and autocratic manner. <i>He tyrannizes over the servants.</i>
