banish	Get rid of (something unwanted). <i>All thoughts of romance were banished from her head.</i>
borough	A municipal corporation in certain US states.
census	Conduct a census. <i>They cenused the deer in the forest.</i>
city	A town created a city by charter and usually containing a cathedral. <i>The city voted for Republicans in 1994.</i>
community	A group of interdependent organisms inhabiting the same region and interacting with each other. <i>They hoped to join the NATO community.</i>
denseness	The quality of being mentally slow and limited.
density	The quantity of mass per unit volume of a substance. <i>Areas of low population density.</i>
deport	Conduct oneself in a specified manner. <i>He was deported to Turkey for his public condemnation of the Shah.</i>
deportation	The expulsion from a country of an undesirable alien. <i>His deportation to a penal colony.</i>
exile	The act of expelling a person from their native land. <i>He knew now that he would die in exile.</i>
expatriate	A person who lives outside their native country. <i>Candidates should be willing to expatriate.</i>
extradite	Hand over to the authorities of another country. <i>Brazil refused to extradite him to Britain.</i>
frontier	The extreme limit of understanding or achievement in a particular area. <i>The success of science in extending the frontiers of knowledge.</i>
ghetto	An isolated or segregated group or area. <i>The relative security of the gay ghetto.</i>

hamlet	The hero of William Shakespeare's tragedy who hoped to avenge the murder of his father.
intern	Serve as an intern. <i>The young doctor is interning at the Medical Center this year.</i>
metropolitan	Relating to or denoting a metropolitan or his see. <i>A metropolitan bishop.</i>
municipal	Relating or belonging to or characteristic of a municipality. <i>International law only authorizes a belligerent to punish a spy under its municipal law.</i>
municipality	The governing body of a municipality. <i>Voters in each municipality choose between four candidates.</i>
<u>neighborhood</u>	A surrounding or nearby region. <i>The price is in the neighborhood of 100.</i>
outskirts	The outer parts of a town or city. <i>They lived on the outskirts of Houston.</i>
populous	Densely populated. <i>The populous city of Shanghai.</i>
resident	(of a computer program, file, etc.) immediately available in computer memory, rather than having to be loaded from elsewhere. <i>The film studio needed a resident historian.</i>
<u>slum</u>	A house or building unfit for human habitation. <i>Slum dwellers.</i>
suburban	Contemptibly dull and ordinary. <i>Elizabeth despised Ann's house proudness as deeply suburban.</i>
<u>town</u>	The chief city or town of a region. <i>Britain's major towns and cities.</i>
underpopulated	Having an insufficient or very small population. <i>The richly endowed but underpopulated Ivory Coast.</i>
<u>village</u>	A self-contained district or community within a town or city regarded as having features characteristic of village life. <i>All the village could do was listen.</i>
villager	One who has lived in a village most of their life. <i>Angry villagers have been forced to leave flooded areas.</i>
westerner	An inhabitant of a western area; especially of the U.S.
