## Associations of "For privacy" (30 Words)

<b>alone</b>	Without anybody else or anything else. <i>She is <b>alone</b> much of the time.</i>
<b>clandestine</b>	Kept secret or done secretly, especially because illicit. <i><b>Clandestine</b> intelligence operations.</i>
<b>cloistered</b>	Kept away from the outside world; sheltered. <i>The <b>cloistered</b> academic world of books.</i>
<a href="#">forlorn</a>	Pitifully sad and abandoned or lonely. <i>A <b>forlorn</b> cause.</i>
<a href="#">hermit</a>	A reclusive or solitary person.
<b>hide</b>	Cover as if with a shroud. <i>Companies with poor security can <b>hide</b> behind the law.</i>
<b>individual</b>	A single member of a class. <i><b>Individual</b> drops of rain.</i>
<b>isolate</b>	A person or thing that has been or become isolated. <i>Engineers <b>isolated</b> the gas supply to the house.</i>
<b>isolated</b>	Not close together in time. <i><b>Isolated</b> farms and villages.</i>
<a href="#">isolation</a>	The act of isolating something; setting something apart from others. <i><b>Isolation</b> from family and friends may also contribute to anxiety.</i>
<a href="#">lone</a>	Characterized by or preferring solitude. <i>A <b>lone</b>ly existence.</i>
<b>loneliness</b>	Sadness resulting from being forsaken or abandoned. <i>The <b>loneliness</b> of the farm.</i>
<b>lonely</b>	Lacking companions or companionship. <i>A <b>lonely</b> existence.</i>
<b>lonesome</b>	Solitary or lonely. <i>She felt <b>lonesome</b> and out of things.</i>

<b>personal</b>	Of or arising from personality. <i>I have something <b>personal</b> to tell you.</i>
<b><u>recluse</u></b>	A person who lives a solitary life and tends to avoid other people. <i>She has turned into a virtual <b>recluse</b>.</i>
<b><u>remote</u></b>	A remote control device. <i>Considerations entirely removed or <b>remote</b> from politics.</i>
<b>seclude</b>	Keep away from others. <i>I <b>secluded</b> myself up here for a life of study and meditation.</i>
<b><u>secluded</u></b>	(of a place) not seen or visited by many people; sheltered and private. <i>A <b>secluded</b> romantic spot.</i>
<b>seclusion</b>	The quality of being secluded from the presence or view of others. <i>They enjoyed ten days of peace and <b>seclusion</b>.</i>
<b><u>secrecy</u></b>	The action of keeping something secret or the state of being kept secret. <i>The bidding is conducted in <b>secrecy</b>.</i>
<b><u>sequester</u></b>	Isolate or hide away. <i>The estate was <b>sequestered</b>.</i>
<b><u>sole</u></b>	Put a new sole on. <i>A big blister on each heel and <b>sole</b>.</i>
<b><u>solitary</u></b>	Single; only. <i>Each spider like bloom is <b>solitary</b>.</i>
<b><u>solitude</u></b>	A state of social isolation. <i>The battle to preserve beloved <b>solitudes</b> flared up all over the country.</i>
<b>troglydite</b>	One who lives in solitude. Not likely to be rewarded.
<b><u>unappreciated</u></b>	<i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt <b>unappreciated</b> and undervalued.</i>
<b>unrewarding</b>	Not rewarding; not providing personal satisfaction. <i>It was dull <b>unrewarding</b> work.</i>
<b>unsung</b>	Having value that is not acknowledged. <i><b>Unsung</b> heroes of the war.</i>
<b><u>withdrawn</u></b>	Withdrawn from society seeking solitude. <i>When her husband died she became very <b>withdrawn</b>.</i>
