| isolate | A person or thing that has been or become isolated. <i>Engineers isolated the gas supply to the house.</i> |
| isolated | Not close together in time. <i>Isolated farms and villages.</i> |
| isolation | The act of isolating something; setting something apart from others. <i>Isolation from family and friends may also contribute to anxiety.</i> |
| lone | Characterized by or preferring solitude. <i>A lonely existence.</i> |
| loneliness | Sadness resulting from being forsaken or abandoned. <i>The loneliness of the farm.</i> |
| lonely | Lacking companions or companionship. <i>A lonely existence.</i> |
| lonesome | Solitary or lonely. <i>She felt lonesome and out of things.</i> |

| personal | Of or arising from personality. <i>I have something personal to tell you.</i> |
| <u>recluse</u> | A person who lives a solitary life and tends to avoid other people. <i>She has turned into a virtual recluse.</i> |
| <u>remote</u> | A remote control device. <i>Considerations entirely removed or remote from politics.</i> |
| seclude | Keep away from others. <i>I secluded myself up here for a life of study and meditation.</i> |
| <u>secluded</u> | (of a place) not seen or visited by many people; sheltered and private. <i>A secluded romantic spot.</i> |
| seclusion | The quality of being secluded from the presence or view of others. <i>They enjoyed ten days of peace and seclusion.</i> |
| <u>secrecy</u> | The action of keeping something secret or the state of being kept secret. <i>The bidding is conducted in secrecy.</i> |
| <u>sequester</u> | Isolate or hide away. <i>The estate was sequestered.</i> |
| <u>sole</u> | Put a new sole on. <i>A big blister on each heel and sole.</i> |
| <u>solitary</u> | Single; only. <i>Each spider like bloom is solitary.</i> |
| <u>solitude</u> | A state of social isolation. <i>The battle to preserve beloved solitudes flared up all over the country.</i> |
| troglydyte | One who lives in solitude. Not likely to be rewarded. |
| <u>unappreciated</u> | <i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt unappreciated and undervalued.</i> |
| unrewarding | Not rewarding; not providing personal satisfaction. <i>It was dull unrewarding work.</i> |
| unsung | Having value that is not acknowledged. <i>Unsung heroes of the war.</i> |
| <u>withdrawn</u> | Withdrawn from society seeking solitude. <i>When her husband died she became very withdrawn.</i> |
