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Associations of "For privacy" (30 Words)

alone	Without anybody else or anything else. <i>She is alone much of the time.</i>
clandestine	Kept secret or done secretly, especially because illicit. <i>Clandestine intelligence operations.</i>
cloistered	Kept away from the outside world; sheltered. <i>The cloistered academic world of books.</i>
forlorn	Pitifully sad and abandoned or lonely. <i>A forlorn cause.</i>
hermit	A reclusive or solitary person.
hide	Cover as if with a shroud. <i>Companies with poor security can hide behind the law.</i>
individual	A single member of a class. <i>Individual drops of rain.</i>
isolate	A person or thing that has been or become isolated. <i>Engineers isolated the gas supply to the house.</i>
isolated	Not close together in time. <i>Isolated farms and villages.</i>
isolation	The act of isolating something; setting something apart from others. <i>Isolation from family and friends may also contribute to anxiety.</i>
lone	Characterized by or preferring solitude. <i>A lonely existence.</i>
loneliness	Sadness resulting from being forsaken or abandoned. <i>The loneliness of the farm.</i>
lonely	Lacking companions or companionship. <i>A lonely existence.</i>
lonesome	Solitary or lonely. <i>She felt lonesome and out of things.</i>

personal	Of or arising from personality. <i>I have something personal to tell you.</i>
<u>recluse</u>	A person who lives a solitary life and tends to avoid other people. <i>She has turned into a virtual recluse.</i>
<u>remote</u>	A remote control device. <i>Considerations entirely removed or remote from politics.</i>
seclude	Keep away from others. <i>I secluded myself up here for a life of study and meditation.</i>
<u>secluded</u>	(of a place) not seen or visited by many people; sheltered and private. <i>A secluded romantic spot.</i>
seclusion	The quality of being secluded from the presence or view of others. <i>They enjoyed ten days of peace and seclusion.</i>
<u>secrecy</u>	The action of keeping something secret or the state of being kept secret. <i>The bidding is conducted in secrecy.</i>
<u>sequester</u>	Isolate or hide away. <i>The estate was sequestered.</i>
<u>sole</u>	Put a new sole on. <i>A big blister on each heel and sole.</i>
<u>solitary</u>	Single; only. <i>Each spider like bloom is solitary.</i>
<u>solitude</u>	A state of social isolation. <i>The battle to preserve beloved solitudes flared up all over the country.</i>
troglydyte	One who lives in solitude.
<u>unappreciated</u>	Not likely to be rewarded. <i>She had been brought up in a family where she felt unappreciated and undervalued.</i>
unrewarding	Not rewarding; not providing personal satisfaction. <i>It was dull unrewarding work.</i>
unsung	Having value that is not acknowledged. <i>Unsung heroes of the war.</i>
<u>withdrawn</u>	Withdrawn from society seeking solitude. <i>When her husband died she became very withdrawn.</i>
