achromatic	Having no hue. <i>The achromatic gloom.</i>
blue	A distinction awarded to a Cambridge blue or an Oxford blue. <i>A flyweight boxing blue.</i>
brownish	Having a brown tinge; slightly brown. <i>A brownish coloured cat.</i>
carmine	Color carmine. <i>Carmine roses.</i>
color	Add color to. <i>The child colored the drawings.</i>
colored	Having color or a certain color; sometimes used in combination. <i>Colored crepe paper.</i>
crimson	Of a rich deep red colour inclining to purple. <i>She blushed crimson with embarrassment.</i>
ebony	Hard dark colored heartwood of the ebony tree used in cabinetwork and for piano keys. <i>His ebony hair.</i>
flushed	(of a person's skin) red and hot, typically as the result of illness or strong emotion. <i>Flushed with success I was getting into my stride.</i>
gray	The SI unit of energy absorbed from ionizing radiation equal to the absorption of one joule of radiation energy by one kilogram of matter one gray equals 100 rad. <i>Gray flannel suit.</i>
hue	A colour or shade. <i>Men of all political hues submerged their feuds.</i>
imbue	Fill soak or imbue totally. <i>His works are invariably imbued with a sense of calm and serenity.</i>

magenta	A primary subtractive color for light a dark purple red color the dye for magenta was discovered in 1859 the year of the battle of Magenta. <i>Bright pink double flowers each lined in dark magenta.</i>
maroon	A person who is stranded (as on an island). <i>The travellers were marooned.</i>
mauve	Of a pale to moderate greyish violet color. <i>Glowing with soft pastel mauves and pinks.</i>
negligee	A woman's light dressing gown, typically made of a filmy, soft fabric. <i>A black silk negligee.</i>
 Painted	Wearing make-up or cosmetics. <i>Brazen Painted faces.</i>
pigmentation	The deposition of pigment in animals or plants or human beings.
pimpernel	European garden herb with purple-tinged flowers and leaves that are sometimes used for salads.
pink	The pink ball in snooker. <i>McFowler pinked every sheep and never drew blood.</i>
red	A red wine. <i>With puffy reddened eyes.</i>
rose	The flower of a rose bush. <i>All is not roses in the firm today.</i>
roseate	Used in names of birds with partly pink plumage e g roseate tern. <i>The roseate glow of dawn.</i>
rosy	Presaging good fortune. <i>A rosy future.</i>
ruddy	Make ruddy in colour. <i>The ruddy evening light.</i>
scarlet	Scarlet clothes or material. <i>A mass of scarlet berries.</i>
strawberry	The low growing plant which produces the strawberry having white flowers lobed leaves and runners and found throughout north temperate regions. <i>She thought she would wear the strawberry crushed velvet.</i>
tulip	Any of numerous perennial bulbous herbs having linear or broadly lanceolate leaves and usually a single showy flower.
white	Trousers made of flannel or gabardine or tweed or white cloth. <i>White Australian culture.</i>
yellow	Affected by jaundice which causes yellowing of skin etc. <i>Yellowed parchment.</i>
